Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held at the home of Mr & Mrs J. Lawrence  
on 8 July 1992 at 7.30 pm

1. The meeting was attended by 14 members and 2 visitors, with 5 apologies.
2. The Chairperson, Mrs B. Lawrence, extended a warm welcome to everyone present, and requested that a period of silence be observed in memory of Mr Ron Dale.
3. Minutes of the 1991 Annual General Meeting held on 17 July 1991 were read and accepted as being a true record (Prop: R. Roth, Sec: T. Chance)
4. Matters Arising
  - i. Mr T. Chance reported that a lot of preparatory work has been done in planning an adult education course in Astronomy, which will be run in 1993.
  - ii. Due to the relocation of the Pietermaritzburg Music School it had been necessary to find an alternative venue for the Centre to meet, and it had been fortuitous that negotiations with St. Charles College had been finalised for 1992.
  - iii. Mr J. Watson had been able to attend the National Symposium in Capetown in April 1992, and reported that it had been a first class experience.
  - iv. The Lipschitz telescope had been recovered from Durban, and work is well under way in restoring/modifying it to suit our 12" mirror.
  - v. The Centre's library has been moved to St. Charles, and several new books have been purchased.
5. Chairman's Report (Prop: R. Jarmain, Sec: T. Chance)

Mrs B. Lawrence gave a comprehensive review of the various activities of the Centre, and thanked all the members for their contributions towards a busy and successful year.
6. Treasurer's Report (Prop: R. Roth, Sec: T. Chance)

Mrs H. Chance presented the statement of Income & Expenditure for the previous year, which reflected a closing balance of R1017-75, a gain of some R275 over the opening balance. Despite this profit, it was pointed out that:-

  - i. Capital expenses would be incurred during the coming year due to the purchase of materials etc to finish off the Centre's 12" telescope
  - ii. Increased costs of printing and postage, plus annual subscriptions, are not being adequately covered by the present membership fees.

A proposal was put to the meeting (Prop: T. Chance, Sec: C. Lake) that annual membership subscriptions be increased by R5-00 in each category. After some discussion, the proposal was accepted (with 1 against). The revised annual subscriptions will therefore be:-

7. Election of New Committee

## 8. Instruments

Dr G.Prosser gave an up-to-date report on the status of the Centre's telescopes.

- i. the 6" reflector is in a bad state of repair and effectively out of action until such time as it can be rebuilt/refurbished.
- ii. the 10" Lipschitz mirror has been cleaned up and re-silvered by a local business (aluminised) who have done a good job. It will be used to make a simple Dobsonian for use at viewing evenings.
- iii. the 12" mirror is polished and ready for silvering - the next stage is to acquire a suitable tube (some 14½" x 5'6"). This instrument will not really be portable and therefore consideration must be given to finding a suitable permanent site to set it up.
- iv. a small sub-committee must be set up to complete this project

## 9. Other business

- a) Many members had observed the solar eclipse on 30/6/92, and some had been able to take photographs. R.Forder had had some difficulty in understanding the measurements used in determining the percentage of the eclipse, and had written to Natal Witness about this.
- b) G.Prosser and S.Dale had been doing as much occultation observing/timing as possible, but not as much as in previous years.
- c) T.Chance reported some shuttle sightings
- d) P.Moore has a 6" telescope for sale - mounting is missing, but there are quite a lot of extras to go with it as well.
- e) Upcoming events
  - i) J.Watson to address land service camp at Cedara
  - ii) TM group want some guidance as to constellation shapes and locations
  - iii) Public viewing evening in Ladysmith to inaugurate the establishment of an Astronomical Society
- f) Sincere vote of thanks to the Lawrence's for the use of their home
