

Committee Meeting - July 1. 1930

Held at the residence of Mr. A.W. Long R.R. 3
Carnegie. Newbury. at 8 pm.

Present. Mr. H.C. Mason in the Chair. Messrs. Long
Jeany Mc Intyre Forbes. Pratt & The Hon Secretary
Minutes of Committee Meeting held 3rd May were
read and confirmed

Arising out of minutes. The Hon Secretary reported that
Mr. J. Williams had sent a cheque in accordance with
the Committee resolution which brought him into good
standing to June 30. 1930. A letter had been written
to Mr. Schaber and also to Mr. Wood of Johnsons
Down but replies had not been received. As Mr. Wood
had never paid a subscription his name had been
removed from the roll of membership. - A letter had
also been written to Mr. Mackenzie - no direct reply
had been received.

A letter had been addressed to S. Stevenson re
addressing the Centre at the Annual Meeting
a reply had been received from S. Stevenson
stating he would be in Cape Town from 7 to 10 July.
and would address the meeting on July 9. This
had been accepted.

The Hon Secretary then read a draft Annual
Report. which was considered - and after various
amendments adopted for presentation at the
sixteenth Annual Meeting.

The Hon Treasurer (Mr. A. F. J. Forbes) gave
particulars of the finances of the Centre
to be embodied in the Financial Statement
Subscriptions received was £64.12.11. Anticipated Balance £13.13.0.
It was agreed that this was satisfactory -

Mr. Long called attention to an article in the
day Cape Times on Comets - It was very evident
that the writer was Mr. Mc Intyre, he proposed

a vote of thanks to Mr Mc Intyre for his and many other articles contributed by him to the press in the interests of Astronomy.
This was agreed to with acclamation.

Nomination. The following nomination for membership was then considered and passed for election

Mr Ridley Cecil Shipman 60 Strand St. (Captain Propounded by Mr A.W. Long. Seconded by Mr S.J. McIntyre. The Committee then proceeded to consider the Agenda for the Annual Meeting to be held on 9th July, and nominations were received for officers for the ensuing year.
