

"The Amateur's Telescope". The address dealt with telescopes generally but more particularly with reflectors. He stressed the importance of aperture, reflecting of fair aperture could be obtained at the cost of refractors of much smaller aperture, moreover reflecting mirrors were not difficult to make by anyone having the application. He did not advise the use of mirrors of less than nine or ten inches and described what could be seen with this.

Lantern slides and illustrations were exhibited through the Spidroscope, which included drawings of Jupiter Mars. made by him.

A discussion followed, and after Capt Ainslie had replied to questions. a vote of thanks was accorded him with acclamation and the proceedings terminated.
