

Minutes of the Committee Meeting held at the Royal Observatory at 5.30 p.m. on Monday 10th February, 1964.

The Chairman, Mr. G. R. Atkins, presided.

An apology for absence was received from Mr. Lagerweij. The minutes of the previous Committee Meeting were read and confirmed.

Mr. Bondietti stated that he had been involved in cataloguing the books belonging to the Society for some time. This task which had turned out to be a long one in view of an unexpectedly large number of works was well underway but would still take some time.

The Committee after some discussion, decided a fixed charge of 5/- a cup be levied for tea. The ~~unanimous~~ decision that H.M.A. Dr. Day be allowed to use ^{for other meetings} the Centre's tea equipment ~~was~~ was carried unanimously.

Thereafter the Committee discussed possible speakers during the coming months. Mr. Bondietti asked if a talk on life on other planets would not be suitable and Mr. I said that he would ask a lecturer in the Zoology Department in this regard. Mr. Atkins recalled an interesting address by a member of the R.O. staff. Surveyors were shown the 40" telescope, and the Secretary said he would approach Mr. T. Russo in this connection.

Among other suggestions, Mr. Krumm proposed that monthly notices of the Royal Astronomical Association be read out and clarified where necessary by senior astronomers, and this would be borne in mind in the future.

The Secretary proposed a motion of thanks to Mr. & Mrs. Atkins for initiating the setting up of the new meeting room - this was unanimously adopted.

A discussion then ensued as to the possibility of a Donation by the Centre towards the Telescope Making ~~by~~ Section, with the object of assisting the erection of a permanent domed building to house a 12" telescope that could be used by the Centre.

Mr. I. Kamm proposed that the matter be put to a General Meeting of the Centre, and it was agreed that this be done and that the Secretary draft a 'newsletter' in which details of the telescope dome project could be circulated to all members.

Mr. Bandetti raised the matter of the relection of a new Chairman each year just when the outgoing Chairman had become accustomed to the position, and asked if there ~~was~~ was any reason as to why a Chairman could not serve a second consecutive term. There appeared to be no written rule, and ~~but~~ it seemed that the system whereby the Chairman resigned each year was purely traditional. This matter would be reconsidered later.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 7.00 p.m.
