

Minutes of the ordinary General meeting of the Carter held at the Royal Observatory on Wednesday, 11th March, 1970 at 8.00 p.m.

Mr Greenwood gave a resume of what happened at the grazing occultation which was observed just beyond Tower Road on 1.3.70.

The whole operation was extremely successful from all points of view & particular thanks were due to the members of the Treig. Survey who turned out & helped to make it so successful. They brought with them three crystal clocks, six waller-tolles & other equipment. Thanks were also due to the S.A.R.C. for arranging the time signals. All in all many lessons were learned.

The meeting suggested that the Editor of M.N.A.S.A. be requested to publish the Co-ordinates & the transit of Mercury due stalk.

H^r Greenwood then called on Mr. Alexander at the Observatory to address the meeting. A well illustrated and informative talk on "Stellar Population in the Galaxy" followed. There were quite a few questions.
