To obtain guarantors and to arrange the publication.

Financial Statement The Treasurer reported a balance in hand of £3/14/9, including receipts from Sales of the Journal of £1/17/6.

Banking Account

It was resolved that the Treasurer should open an account in the name of the Society at the National Bank of South Africa, Ltd., and should close the Society's account in the Post Office Savings Bank, and, consequentially, that the portion of the Resolution passed at the Meeting of the 26th October last, which repealed certain relevant provisions in the Bye-Laws and directed the submission of an amending Bye-Law to the next Annual Meeting, be hereby rescinded.
