Statement

The Treasurer read the audited Financial
Statement of the Society for the year ended
30th June, 1923.

The Chairman reported that the Council
had adopted the Statement subject to its
amendment by the inclusion on both sides
of the account of the contribution of £8
made by the late Cape Astronomical Association
towards the cost of printing the Constitution.
On the motion of Mr. Potts, seconded by Mr.
Houghton, the Financial Statement was adopted
as amended by the Council.

Mr. W. Reid, Director of the Comet Section, read
his Report for the past year.

Observing Sections

Mr. D. G. McIntyre, Director of the Meteor Section, read his Report for the past year.

Mr. Reid showed some curious drawings of meteors and their trails which he had observed through the telescope.

Some discussion ensued in the course of which it was pointed out that country Members had much advantage over town Members in observational work for this Section.

The Chairman urged that greater attention in general should be paid to the observing of meteors.

The Chairman read the Reports of Mr. Worsstell and Dr. Noir as Directors of the Variable Stars and Mars Sections respectively.

The Chairman said he agreed with Dr. Noir that no useful observations of Mars could have been made during the year.

The Secretary stated that no Report had been received from the Director of the Lunar Section.

Amendment It was resolved, nem. con., to confirm the of Bylaw 5, amendment of Bylaw 5 reported by the Council in regard to the signing of the Council's cheques, namely, the deletion of the words 'and the President' in line 9.
