

Minutes of a meeting of the Council of the Astronomical Society of Africa held at Mr Long's house, "Camdeba", Melrose Rd, Montevue, on Monday 17 March 1930
at 8pm.

Present

Differences (V. Pres.) in the Chair, Messrs Russell, Giles, Mary, Dr. Mason, McElroy, Schreyer, Stevens, Smith & Wrighton (Hon. Secretary)
(Capt. Cameron) was on his way to England and expected being absent.

Minutes

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed. The Chairman stated he understood there was some delay in regard to the transfer of the Radcliffe Observatory (S.A.) and it was possible that Dr Knox-Kent would not arrive till June or July. It was hoped that the Society might have an opportunity of meeting both him and Dr Stevenson.

Correspondence The Secretary laid on the table the letters received & copies of those written since the last meeting including -

Letter of 11 March from Natal Union Association acknowledging journals sent.

Letter of 3 February from Observatory Centre regarding loan of books from the Library.

Letter of 16 February from Dr Eason mentioning Dr Stevenson's activities in Potchefstroom where he was testing a site for the new Radcliffe Observatory.

Letter of 27 January from Mr A. J. Moore who had since joined the Society as a student associate.

Correspondence with Dr Parastoo of Bloemfontein and his brother regarding the predictions of occultations for Bloemfontein given in the B.A.R. Handbook for 1930. It was thought no action need be taken to have them published in the Press. Dr Jones remarked on Dr Moir's success as an amateur observer of occultations.

Financial position

The Treasurer read his statement dated 17th March showing balance in hand £7.9.8, cost of last journal £1.0.6 (Vol. 2 No. 4) was £52.10s upwards £17.10s was still unpaid. Discussion followed on the cost of the journal which was on the basis agreed by the printers. The journal was however an enlarged number and it was thought that the cost of future issues should be kept down to about £1.0s. The Secretary was instructed to ask the Observatory Centre to send a contribution as required by the Constitution as soon as convenient in order that the printers might not be kept waiting for settlement. The Council approved the purchase of a fibre case for 6/9 for the

The Secretary had written for a review copy of "The Lagoon of the Stars" by Langley, and he was instructed to write similarly for a copy of "Stars of the Southern Heavens" by Nangle. The Librarian had received copies of "Revista Astronomica" published by the Association of Friends of Astronomy at Buenos Ayres, and it was agreed to add that Society to the list. A copy of the last Journal would be sent to Dr. Lund.

Annual Meeting —

The Chairman stated that Mr. Wood would be attending the meeting of the South African Association for the Advancement of Science at Cape Town in July and the Secretary was instructed to ask him when it would be convenient for him to visit Cape Town and deliver his Presidential Address.

The meeting then terminated.
