It was agreed to order 324 copies of Sky and Telescope starting with the April issue.

A letter from Mr. F.M. Bateson, P.O. Box 39, Rarotonga, Cook Islands, South Pacific, was read by the Hon. Secretary. Mr. Bateson was sending 300 copies of a booklet on Variable Star observing, for distribution to members of the Society.

It was agreed to send Mr. Bateson future issues of the Monthly Notes as a gesture of appreciation.

An invitation to be present at the inaugural meeting of the Science Writers' Association of South Africa at the Witwatersrand University was read by the Hon. Secretary.

A request from the C.S.I.R. for details of scientific conferences which may be held by the Society for publication in the journal "C.S.I.R. Information", was read by the Hon. Secretary. This was agreed to by Council.

An invitation to send two delegates to Bloemfontein to discuss facilities for teaching and research in the sciences at South African universities and how these facilities should be improved, received from Professor C.B. van Wyk, was read.

Council decided to ask the Bloemfontein Centre to appoint two of their members to attend the conference.

Dr. Evans reported that in a conversation with Mr. Lagerweij he was told that the Transvaal Centre had not yet decided on a Director for the Meteor Section of the Society, but that Mr. R.S. Tuffin had expressed his willingness to act as Director of a Nova search Section.

Council asked Dr. Evans to draft a letter accepting Mr. Tuffin's offer, and giving details of a suggested observing procedure.

Mr. P. Smits agreed to accept nomination as President of the Society for 1959-1960.

It was decided to publish the spectral types and declinations of occultation stars in the 1960 Handbook.

A committee to discuss the housing and administration of the Society's library and to report back at the next Council meeting was elected, and consists of the following:
