Astronomical Society of Southern Africa. Report of the Council for the Session 1958-1959.

Five Council meetings were held during the year. Sixty-six new Members and eighteen Associate Members were elected. The membership of the Society at present comprises 310 members, 40 Associate Members, and 9 Honorary Members. Centres of the Society exist at Cape Town, in the Transvaal (Johannesburg and Pretoria) at Port Elizabeth, Durban, and at Bloemfontein, where a centre has now been started, largely due to the enthusiasm and drive of our President, Professor H. Haffner.

Council records with regret the deaths of Dr. J. Jackson, a Gill Medallist and of Mr. A.F.I. Forbes, both past Presidents of the Society, and Honorary Members. Obituary notices have been published in MNASSA.

The regular distribution of MNASSA and of 'Sky & Telescope' has been continued. The circulat ion of the Monthly Notes has shown a steady increase. Council wishes to record it's appreciation of the work done by the editors, Drs. Stoy and Evans, and of Mr. H.E. Krumm, in charge of the business arrangements.

The Handbook for 1959 was issued, and supplied a steadily increasing demand. Council records it's thanks to the Transvaal Computing Section which provided the numerical data.

No award of the Gill Medal was made during the year.

A fair number of entries was received in the Essay Competition, and the general standard was excellent. The first 26f £5.5.0. is being awarded to G. Rosenthal of Diocesan College Cape Town. The second and third prizes, totalling £3.3.0. is being divided between,

The Nova Section has been revised under the directorship of Mr. R.S. Tuffin.

It was with regret that Council received the resignation of Mr. Venter, as director of the Meteor Section, owing to ill health. The service rendered in the past by Mr. Venter is very much appreciated and it is hoped that a successor, to carry on with this aspect of the Society's activities will soon be forthcoming.

Council wishes to place on record it's appreciation and thanks to Mr. F.M. Bateson of Cook Islands, South Pacific, for his gift of 300 copies of his booklet on Variable Star Observing, for distribution to Members of the Society who may desire to use the book as a guide to observing these stars.

Council has made available a grant of \$50. towards the cost of rehabilitating the Society's Library. The recommendations of a Library Housing Committee, consisting of Dr. Stoy, Messrs. Smits, Duncan and Meadows, have been adopted.

The Society's Librarian, Mr. R. Lake, wishes to acknowledge with thanks the receipt of journals and other publications during the year.

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held at the Royal Observatory on Wednesday, 22nd July at 8.2.M.

Dr. Stoy presided. The attendance was good.

Apologies for absence were received from Mr. Menzies. Mr. Keet and Mr. Raphaely.

The Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on the 23rd July, 1958 were read and confirmed.

The Annual Report of Council was then presented by the Acting Secretary. The total membership of the Society was shewn as 359. The deaths of Dr. J. Jackson a Gill medallist, and of Mr. A.F.I. Forbes both past Presidents were noted with regret. The results of the Essay Competition were announced. Only a fair number of entries had been received but the general standard was good.

Mr. Orpen read the financial statement, which was adopted by the meeting, on the motion of Mr. P. Smiths, recorded by Mr. Loon. This disclosed that the year ended with a credit balance of £137.2.3. of which £53. 11.0. was advance subscriptions. In addition there was £125 on fixed deposit at the Standard Bank, A.B.C. Branch, Cape Town.

The report of the Variable Star Section was read by Mr. Krumm. Over 8000 observations had been made, of which the Director, Mr. De Cock was responsible for 6518.

Transvaal " " Dr. Wayman.

The activities of these centres were noted with gratification and it was resolved that congratulations should be sent to them, particularly to Dr, Haffner and the Bloemfontein Centre, which had only recently been inaugurated.
