Minutes of Annual General Teeting held at the Royal Observatory on Wednesday 27th July 1960 at 8.00 p.m.

Mr P. Smits presided. The attendance was good.

An apology for absence had been received from Dr. Evans.

The Minutes of Annual General Meeting held on the 22nd July 1959 were read and confirmed.

To mark the completion of twenty-five years as Honorary Secretary of the Society, the Honorary Secretary, Mr. A. Lenzies, was presented with a cheque by the Fresident, Mr. Smits. The Honorary Secretary replied thanking members for the gift.

The Gill Medal which had been awarded to Dr. W. A. van den Ros by the Council of the Society, was presented by Mr. Smits, with the Citation:

"For outstanding contributions to double star astronomy, a field in which he has been for many years the acknowledged authority. As a visual observer his output has been approached by few, as regards both quantity and quality, and exceeded by none. Throughout his career he has applied his great analytical skill and critical insight to the problems of binary star orbit computation, and the methods and procedures he originated have already become allost standard practice. In addition he has found time for the prodigious task of compiling a complete catalogue of observations of Southern double stars, all the entries in which he himself checked from the original publications."

Dr. van den Bos in replying to Mr. Smits, said that Dr. Finsen was continuing to observe double stars at Johannesburg, using the eye-end interferometer method invented by himself. The observations could be more easily made with a large reflecting telescope such as the 78-inch disc at present in England awaiting shipment to South Africa, should the Union Government decide to proceed with the installation of the instrument.

Members present gave Dr. van den Bos an ovation at the conclusion of his reply.

The Annual Report of Council was read by the Hon. Secretary and adopted.

The Financial Statement, presented and read by Mr. Orpen, was adopted on the motion of Mr. Hurley, seconded by Mr. Meadows, and read as follows:
