A committee consisting of Dr. Evans and the Hon. Secretary was elected to reply to a questionaire received from the South African Nature Union on the aims and objects of the Astronomical Society.

A copy of the 1963 Handbook was sent, as all the relevant information was to be found on the covers of the book.

A letter from Mr. Bell the Hon. Secretary of the Transvaal Centre of the Society, was read to the meeting. The address of the Transvaal Centre has been changed to c/o The Planetarium, Milner Park, Johannesburg.

The Hon. Secretary read a letter from the Scientific Adviser to the Prime Minister, who said it would be appreciated if his office could be notified of future meeting or conferences which might be of importance to them. Any supplementary information forwarded to his office would be greatly valued.

A letter received from the Land Surveyers' Institute of the Cape Province was read. There was to be a second National Conference of South African Surveyors in February 1964, and the Hon. Secretary was asked to bring the advance Notice to the attention of all interested Members of the Society.

The meeting ended at 10.00 p.m., after members had wished Mr. Churms who was leaving for England on leave in a few Day's time, 'bon voyage'.
