# Report of the Council for the Session 1962 - 63

Six Council meetings were held during the year. Thirty-four new Meers, 1 Student member, and 5 Associates were elected.

The total number of ordinary Members in good standing is now 291, wi 48 Associates and 9 Honorary Members.

Mr. W. Andrews, a former Librarian of the Society, member of Council and Society member for many years, died during the year. Council records it appreciation of the work done for the Society in past years by Mr. Andrew.

Members were privileged to hear lectures during the year by several distinguished visitors, including the Astronomer Royal, Sir Richard van dr Riet Woolley.

By invitation of the Royal Society, members heard talks by Professor Blackwell and MacCrae.

The regular distribution of MNASSA and of "Sky and Telescope" has ben continued and a Handbook issued for 1963.

The Council wishes to record its appreciation of the work done by the Editorial Board, and by Mr. Krumm, the business manager of MNASSA.

A booklet on the Annular Sclipse of the Sun on 25 January 1963, compiled under the direction of Dr. Evans by Messrs. G. R. Atkins, J. Simenhoff, L. Weinberg and J. D. Laing, found a ready sale and helped the Society financially.

Council records its thanks for the gift from the Royal Society of a reprint from the "Biographical Memoirs of Fellows of the Royal Society". This was the memoir of the late Sir Harold Spencer Jones. F.R.S., a Past President of this Society, and, at the time of his death, an Honorary Member.

The thanks of Council are due to Mr. D. G. McIntyre, one of two surviving Foundation Members of the Society, for the gift of a 3-inch Cooke refractor together with tripod and eye-pieces.

The Gill Medal is to be awarded to Dr. A. W. J. Cousins, with the Citation:

"In recognition of his services in the establishment of an accurate system of Photometry in the Southern Hemisphere, and of the high quality of the photometric observations of variable and other stars, made when he was still an amateur."

Council expresses its thanks to the Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer for their services during the past year.

This statement was adopted on the motion of Mr. Wellgate, seconded by Mr. Simenhoff. Tribute was paid by the Chairman to the valuable services rendered by Mr. Orpen, the Treasurer, and the assistance given by the two Auditors, Mr. Raphaely and Mr. Bentley. A very good financial position was disclosed.

Prize winners in the Forbes Essay Competition were announced by Mr. Meadows, one of the adjudicators; as follows:

Senior section ( over 15 years of age )

1st Prize of R10 to F. A. Shillington of Graeme College, Grahamstown.

2nd Prize of R5 to A. Steyn of Wynberg Boys' High School, Wynberg.

Junior section ( under 15 years of age )

2nd Prize of R4 to D. Clarke of Pinelands Primary School, Pinelands.

Mr. Meadows stated that only four entries had been received, less than in previous years, which was regrettable. Mr. Meadows and his co-adjudicator, Prof. Cillie were thanked by Mr. Smits for judging the essays.

Mr. Smits then read the Annual Report of Council. Tribute was paid to the many people who contributed towards a very successful year and to Dr. Stoy for his guidance, help and support. The Gill Medal was awarded to Dr. A. W. J. Cousins, in recognition of his services in the establishment of an accurate system of Photometry in the Southern

Hemisphere, and of the high quality of the photometric observations of variable and other stars, made when he was still an amateur.

Unfortunately Dr. Cousins was not present, owing to illness, and the actual presentation had to be posponed for a future date.

In amplification of the Citation, Dr. Stoy spoke of the valuable work done by Dr. Cousins while an amateur astronomer and then subsequently when he joined the ranks of the Professionals, work which had received world-wide recognition.

Reports of the Bloemfontein and Transvaal Centres were read as well as reports of the Variable Star Section, Comet and Meteor Section and Nova Search Section. These reports showed considerable activity at the Centres and in the various sections concerned.

Mr. Lagerweij, one of the Vice-Presidents, then took the Chair, vacated by Mr. Smits.

The Presidential Address, prepared by the retiring President, Dr. Wesselink, was then read by Mr. Smits. The subject chosen was "Modern Views of Cepheid Variables". Dr. Wesselink was particularly gifted to speak on this aspect of Astronomy, with which he is closely associated. Dr. Stoy, in moving a formal vote of thanks, mentioned the pleasure he had enjoyed in hearing this address, and paid tribute to the evident care in preparation, and the valuable work done by Dr. Wesselink in this regard.

Mr. Smits announced to the Meeting that a gift of a small but effective Planatarium Projector had been received from Mr. Bertish. This projector was suitable for a 10 the dome. It was decided that custody should be in the hands of the Telescope Makers Section, who had plans in hand for erecting a dome. Mr. Bondiette, the head of the Section, was asked to thank the donor. The Auditors were asked to go into the question of additional insurance covering this new asset of the Society.

Before closing at 9.30 p.m. Mr. Lagerweij thanked Dr. Stoy for the use of his office as a venue for the meeting.
