Minutes of Council Meeting held at the Royal Observatory on 1st September, 1965 at 8.00 p.m.

Present: Mr. Lagerweij, Dr. Fuhr, Messrs. Atkins, Bentley, Bondietti, Meadows, Orpen and Russo.

In the absence of the President, Mr. Menzies (on duty at the Radcliffe Observatory, Pretoria) Mr. Lagerweij took the Chair.

Apologies for absence had been received from Dr. Stoy, Mr. Menzies and Mr. Churms.

The first business of the Meeting was the appointment of Alternates for up-country Members of Council. Subject to the consent of the principals concerned, Dr. Fuhr would be Alternate to Mr. J. A. Bruwer, Mr. Churms for Mr. Bell, the Transvaal Centre Representative, Mr. Meadows for Mr. Lincoln of the Bloemfontein Centre and Mr. Bondietti for the Natal Centre. Possible Alternates for Dr. Thackeray and Mr. Geary were Mr. Smits and Mr. Horn. The Secretary was to approach the parties concerned.

The Minutes of the previous Council Meeting held 16 June, 1965 were read and confirmed. Arising out of the Minutes, it was noted that the B.A.A. Journals had been sold and the sum of R39. 30c realized. Letters of thanks and acceptance, received from Dr. Finsen, Dr. Fehrenbach and Professor Velghe were read.

It was suggested that back numbers of this Publication, for which a demand would be considered unlikely should be displayed for sale on Visitors nights. The Secretary would discuss this with Dr. Stoy.

Mr. Bondietti raised the question of the disposal of out-dated books no longer required for the Library. It was agreed that the Library Committee should list these books, price them and then send a copy to each Centre of the Society for information of possible buyers.

It was agreed that one dozen storage boxes for housing Journals could be purchased for the Library.

Minutes of the Committee Meeting of the Transvaal Centre, held on 11th August, were read with interest, and the close contact maintained in this way was very much appreciated.

A questionaire received from the Department of Education, Arts and Science for the purpose of inquiring into the need for and the provision of standardised technical terminology and the need for and training of translators in South Africa was left to be dealt with by Mr. Lagerweij and Mr. Russo.
