Five Council Meetings were held during the year. Thirty-one new members, 11 Associates and 1 Student Member were elected. Membership now totals 296. There are also 11 Honorary Members.

The regular distribution of MNASSA and of "Sky and Telescope" has been continued and a Handbook issued for 1966. Council wishes to record its appreciation of the work done by the Editorial Board, particularly by Dr. Stoy, and by Mr. Bentley, business Manager of MNASSA. Apart from the issue of these Notes to members, some 170 copies are distributed outside Southern Africa.

The subject chosen for the Forbes Essay Competition was "Comets".

Only seven entries were received, a disappointing reduction on last year's figure of fifteen.

Council had been asked to forward to C.S.I.R., its comments on a proposal by the I.A.U. for Training Schools in Astronomy. Council favoured such a scheme and recommended that details, when available, be circularized among S.A. Universities.

A list of old Library Books for disposal was drawn up by the Librarian and a copy circulated in an issue of MNASSA. Practically all these books have been sold. Our thanks are due to the Librarian, Mr. Bondietti for the time and effort given so willingly to the efficient management of the Library. Cataloguing and Binding has been continued as in the past.

Receipt of news from Centres is always welcomed, and where of general interest it is published in the Notes. Council is glad to report the formation of a new centre at Pretoria from a nucleus of Transvaal Centre members, and the sponsers of this movement are to be congratulated. Particular mention should be made of Mr. Sterling in this connection.

Thanks are due to Her Majesty's Astronomer. Dr. R. H. Stoy for facilities afforded at the Royal Observatory for the holding of Council Meetings, and for housing the Library and storing the Society's instruments.

The Treasurer's Report shows a very satisfactory balance and Council's thanks are due to Mr. G. Orpen for his valuable work in this connection.

Council reports with regret the passing of Mr. J. H. Bentley of Pretoria in tragic circumstances. Also the passing of Mr. D. G. McIntyre

of Cape Town, a member of very long standing, also a past President of the Society and a Honorary Member. The Society will benefit financially from a legacy from the Estate and also receive Astronomical Publications.
