In addition to the above balance in the current account, there is an amount of R825 78 (R800 00, plus interest amounting to R25 78) in a Savings Bank Account at the Heerrengracht Branch of the Standard Bank.

In terms of the resolution taken at the Council Meeting held on 19th June 1967 the interest on the bequest made to the Society by the late D. G. McIntyre, plus the balance of capital amounting to R36 09 (the main amount of the bequest being the half-share in a mortgage bond) is to be used to establish a prize to be known as the McIntyre Award. In terms of this, and treating the balance of capital and interest as having been placed in the Savings Bank account when received, the amount available for this award at 30th June 1967 was R108 13. In future Financial Statements the McIntyre Award account will be shown separately from the main account.

The Society also stands possessed of four shares in the S. A. Permanent Building Society to a total value of R200 00, per Certificate C.15778, dated 18/5/1960, and equipment and apparatus as per H. M. Astronomer's certificate (attached to original hereof), insured against fire under Policy 134760, dated 27/2/1962, in the amount of R600 00, with the Southern Insurance Society.

The report from the Director of the Variable Star Section showed the number of observations made during the year as 5282, of which Mr. R. P. de Kock was responsible for 5168.

The following reports were also read:

- (a) The Annual Report of the Bloemfontein Centre which in addition to the record of meetings held throughout the year contained an account of an instructive and enjoyable visit to the Transvaal Centre.
- (b) The Annual Report of the Cape Centre. It was noted that the Construction work on the dome was almost complete and the mirror was now at the figuring stage.
- (c) A report by the Business Manager of MNASSA, in which it was stated that 300 copies were currently being sent to members of the Society, and a further 160 to recipients, the bulk of whom were overseas Scientific Institutions.

The Adjudicators, who were members of the teaching staffs at the Universities of Cape Town and Stellenbosch, remarked:

"We find a most pleasing improvement in both the quantity and the quality of the entries for this year's competition; choosing the prize-winners has been a difficult task. We feel that the idea of choosing a fairly specific topic has contributed greatly to the success of the 1967 Competition. We were particularly pleased to note the considerable increase in the number of Afrikaans essays received.

It is hoped that next year's Competition will again draw entries from all parts of Southern Africa."

The result of the Ballot held in connection with Council's proposal to amend the first section of Article XI, paragraph 3 was 97 for and 2 against.

The Section in question now reads:

"Any member who fails to pay his annual subscription within three calendar months of the due date shall cease to receive publications until the subscription is paid, when all publications so withheld shall IF AVAILABLE be sent to him."

Report of Council for Session 1966/1967

Five Council Meetings were held during the year. 30 new Members, 20 Associates and 1 Student Member were elected. Membership now totals 315 of whom however 22 have been suspended through non-payment of subscriptions. There are also 11 Honorary Members.

Receipt of news from Centres is always welcomed, and where of general interest it is published in the Notes. It is noted that a large proportion of the new Members and Associates has been recruited through the Transvaal and Pretoria Centres. The Society as a whole must benefit from the high level of interest in Astronomy' maintained by and through individual Centres.

The regular distribution of MNASSA and of Sky and Telescope has been continued and a Handbook issued for 1967. Council wishes to record its appreciation of the work done by the Editorial Board, particularly by Dr. Stoy, and by Mr. Bentley, Business Manager of MNASSA. Thanks are due to contributors of articles to the Notes: however an increase in the number submitted would be welcome.

Council resolved to award the Gill Medal to Dr. W. S. Finsen for his distinguished contributions to double star astronomy and planetary photography. He has devoted a life-time to observations of double stars in the southern sky and to the determination of many sets of orbital elements. By his invention and use of the eyepiece interferometer he has notably extended the limits within which accurate observations of double stars are readily possible.

The subject chosen for the Forbes Essay Competition was "The Milky Way". Twenty-two entries were received, a marked increase over the disappointing number received last year. Thanks are due to members who have helped to publicise the competition, particularly to the Pretoria Centre Committee.

The Society's instruments are available for loan to suitable approved individuals or bodies on certain conditions. A new objective of $3\frac{1}{4}$ -inch aperture has been purchased for the Roberts portable telescope.

An informal meeting, attended by the President of the Society, Mr. G. R. Atkins, was held in Johannesburg on 9th February, under the auspices of the South African C.S.I.R. to establish a National Committee for Astronomy. This Committee has now been established with the following terms of reference:

- (a) to form a representative body which could speak authoritatively on behalf of astronomy in South Africa and which could initiate whatever action may be required for the advancement of its interests;
- (b) to promote astronomical activity in South Africa on a national basis;
- (c) to further co-operation amongst those actively participating in astronomical research in South Africa, and
- (d) to advise the President of the C.S.I.R. on matters relating to South African national membership of the International Astronomical Union (IAU) where such advice is requested.

and the President of the Society has been invited to serve as an ex officio member.

The Associated Scientific and Technical Societies of South Africa arranged an exploratory meeting in Johannesburg on 24th February, with a view to establishing a Professional Scientists Joint Council. Dr. Thackeray kindly represented the Society at this meeting. A further meeting is due to be held on 11th August.

As stated in the last report, the Society benefits from a Bequest from the McIntyre Estate. It has been resolved to establish from the interest on the legacy a prize to be known as the McIntyre Award. Conditions governing this award have been published in MNASSA and form an Appendix to the Society's Constitution.

The Treasurer's Report shows a satisfactory balance and Council's thanks are due to Mr. Orpen for his valuable work, now extending over a period of 17 years.

Thanks are due to H. M. Astronomer, Dr. R. H. Stoy for facilities afforded at the Royal Observatory.

Mr. Bondietti, the Librarian has continued the efficient management of the Library, and binding of books has been done in accordance with funds allocated for this purpose.

Council regrets to report the passing of Mr. Henry Welsh on the 16th January. He had been an active and well known member of the Society, the Royal Astronomical Society, the British Astronomical Association, and latterly a member of the Pretoria Centre.
