Report of Subcommittee on MNASSA - June 1968

( D Evan, D'Wels me Bentley)

1. Cost of production of MNASSA It was noted that the U.C.T. Printing Dept. was unable as yet to determine reliably the cost of production of MNASSA. The maximum rate so far charged, viz. R60 for printing, collation and stapling of an issue consisting of 12 pages plus cover, may be taken as giving a (pessimistic) production rate of R5 per page.

3. <u>Handbook</u> In order to cover costs, and reduce the proportion of expenditure on the Handbook to a realistic amount, the Handbook must be limited to a maximum length of 30 pages, and must be sold at 50 cents or more.

# 4. Reprints and Publication Charges

- (i) Members of the Society Publication will normally be free of charge, but the Editors reserve the right to charge (at cost or less) for diagrams and/or plates. 10 reprints will be supplied, free of charge, to the author(s) of the contribution.
- (ii) Non-members of the Society A publication charge of R4 per page will be levied; in the case of diagrams or plates, the right to make an additional charge is reserved, as stated above. Contributors paying this publication charge will be entitled to receive up to 50 copies of the reprint of the contribution, without extra charge, provided they are ordered prior to the relevant issue of MNASSA going to press.
- (iii) Copies of reprints in addition to those provided for above, will be supplied at 20 cents per copy. The Editors cannot guarantee to supply additional reprints unless they are ordered prior to the relevant issue of MNASSA going to press. The above-mentioned price may be reduced, at the discretion of the Editors, for orders in excess of 25 copies.
- (iv) Institutional Membership (a) Institutions which are members of the Society may claim the privileges of membership (see (i) above) for publications emanating from the institution as a whole, e.g. Annual Reports, lists of fundamental observations, etc.
- (b) Individual staff members of such institutions, submitting contributions under their own names, shall not normally be accorded the privileges of (i) above, unless they are members of the Society in their own right.
- (c) In recognition of its past and present services to the Society, the Royal Cape Observatory shall be regarded as an honorary member of the Society, as will all its individual staff members, for the purpose of determining their publication privileges.

5. Advertising Advertisements accepted for publication in MNASSA will normally be printed on the insides of the cover, or on special additional pages not forming part of the body of the issue. The following rates are suggested in the first instance:

The reduced rates for repeated insertions are subject to confirmation from the printers that "blocks" can be kept for periods up to one year.

Details, such as the specification of type-faces available, the required form of the advertising copy, etc. are now being investigated, following which a suitable advertisement will appear in MNASSA and be circulated to likely customers.

Despatch of MNASSA and SKY AND TELESCOPE Arrangements have been made to have this work done in the Physics Dept., U.C.T., during working hours. A nominal fee will be paid to those doing the work. In addition, a lab. attendant at the University has indicated his willingness to work occasional Saturday mornings at R1.00 per hour. Both schemes are already in use and it is hoped that the entire despatching of periodicals at the end of June will be handled outside of the Observatory.

Council's request that MNASSA should encroach as little as possible on Observatory time will then have been fully met.

### Report of Council for the Session 1968/1969

Four Council Meetings were held during the year; 26 new members, 9 associates and 2 student members were elected. Membership now totals 293, a slight decrease on last year's figure. Of members suspended for non-payment of subscriptions, some 13 are still in arrears. These are not included in the 293 quoted above.

The regular distribution of MNASSA and 'Sky and Telescope' has been continued and a Handbook issued for 1968. Commencing with Volume 27; 1968 January, MNASSA appears in a new format, a vast improvement on the old roneoed publication and it is expected that this will lead to an increased circulation. Special thanks are due to Drs. Evans and Wild and Mr. Bentley for the time and effort devoted to the Society in this connection. In regard to the Handbook, there is a continued demand for this publication and Council wishes to place on record its appreciation of the work put in by the Computing Section in compiling it.

The subject chosen for the Essay Competition was 'The Sun', and a gratifying total of 39 entries was received. To all who helped to publicise the competition thanks are due.

Council was represented at the third meeting arranged to consider the establishment of a Professional Scientists' Joint Council, at which the initial membership was decided upon. This list did not include the ASSA.

No award of the Gill Medal, not of the McIntyre prize has been made.

The Treasurer's Report shows a satisfactory balance and Council is appreciative of the valuable and time-consuming work put in by the Treasurer Mr. Orpen. It is regretted however that in order to maintain this healthy state of affairs, it is necessary to increase the annual subscription to R6 from July 1, as the cost of the publication 'Sky and Telescope' to the Society had been increased by 33 1/3% from that date.

Mention must also be made of the facilities afforded to the Society by H. M. Astronomer, Dr. R. H. Stoy; and of the efficient management of the Society's Library by the Librarian, Mr. Bondietti, also of the service rendered by the Business Manager, Mr. W. C. Bentley, and the Hon. Secretary, Mr. T. W. Russo.
