ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY OF SOUTHERN AFRICA

Minutes of Council Meeting held at the Royal Observatory, Observatory, Cape at 8.00 p.m. on Monday 14th April 1969.

Present: Mr. Bentley (in the Chair), Drs. Cousins and Wild, Messrs Atkins, Churms, Corben, Grimwood, Hurly, Weinberg, and Russo.

Apologies: The Treasurer: Mr. Orpen.

Minutes of the previous meeting held 20th January 1969 were read and confirmed.

Matters arising:

(a) Amendment to Constitution: A report was still being awaited from the Transvaal Centre, although the Vice Chairman of that Centre, Mr. Von Maltitz, had given his personal views on the matter. Views of the Bloemfontein Centre had been received and were discussed. Briefly it was suggested that the National A.G.M. should be held at the larger centres i.e. Cape Town and Johannesburg, preferably alternatively. To date a wide range of helpful suggestions had been received but obviously Council would not be able to recommend any change before the July A.G.M. The present procedure as laid down in the Constitution should therefore be followed, but the opinion was expressed that special thought should be given to organizing the Pretoria part of the Society's A.G.M. (in conjunction with the Transvaal Centre if considered desirable) by the Pretoria Committee. It was fitting, and as a mark of respect for the Office of Presidency, that the President, Mr. Bennett of Pretoria should have a venue in his home town to deliver his presidential address. The A.G.M. was the one and only meeting in the course of the year sponsored by the Asttronmical Society.

(b) McIntyre Award: Proposals for the award in respect of Dr. and Mrs Evans' book on the Herschel diaries had been received. In a 'etter received from Dr. Stoy, it was stated that this work had now been published, presumably in U.K. or the United States. However it was considered that the question of the award should be left over for further consideration when the book became available in South Africa for sighting by Council.

(c) Forbes Essay Competition: The Hon. Secretary was empowered to arrange for Adjudicators before the next Council Meeting.

It was agreed that Dr. Wild should investigate the possibility of obtaining additional assistance for the purpose of completing the issues of missing back numbers, and the summaries of earlier volumes, which were not now deemed necessary to complete with any great advantage.

A suggestion to dispose of surplus copies of out of date Handbooks was not accepted. There might be a demand for some when the re-issues of MNASSA were available.



Council received with gratitude the book "Astronomy" by Fred Hoyle from Mrs. June Hirschberg in memory of her late husband, a one time enthusiastic member of the Society. The Hon. Secretary was instructed to acknowledge this fine gesture and to express Council's appreciation.
