Minutes of Council Meeting held at 8.00 p.m. on Monday February 8th 1971 at the Royal Observatory, Cape.

<u>Present</u>: Mr. Bentley (in the Chair), Dr. Wild, Messrs Atkins, Bondietti, Churms, Harding, Hurly, Molyneux, Orpen, Simenhoff, Russo and Weinberg, Dr. Fairall of the Editorial Board attended for a discussion on the publications issued by the Society.

Apologies: noted from Dr. Cousins, Prof. Jarrett, and Mr. Lagerwey.

Minutes of the Meeting held November 30 read and confirmed.

Matters arising

(a) <u>Student members</u>; apart from the reply received from the Natal Centre already minuted at the previous Council meeting, nothing concrete had been heard from Centres. The Cape Centre had however furnished a composite list of Associate and Student members. The Hon. Secretary was directed to hasten replies.

(b) <u>Constitution</u> The question of considering any amendments was left over until replies had been received from the circular letter issued by the Secretary.

(c) <u>Back issues</u> Dr. Wild reported a satisfactory increase in the demand for these issues from Vol. 16 onwards, and it was anticipated that there would be very little loss, if any at all, in the cost to the Society.

(d) <u>Royal Observatory 150th Anniversary</u> Mr. Harding expressed his appreciation of the assistance rendered by Society members on the Public Viewing Day.

<u>Miscellaneous</u> Agreed to re-instate the P.E. Peoples Observatory Society without penalty - all subs due have been fully paid up.

Mr. Hurly suggested that members of Council, if passing through towns where there are Centres, should make contact with the local Society Committee. His and Mr. Bentley's experience in Durban showed how welcome and stimulating a visit from headquarters could prove.

Mention was made of the fact that the Astronomical Society of Southern Africa would attain the 50th Anniversary of its founding in July 1972. At the same time it would be 60 years since the founding of the Cape Astronomical Association. Some thought would have to be given as to possible means of commemorating this date. Mr. Geary's letter of the 2nd February was read to the Meeting. Several points were raised:

(a) A request for 2 dozen 1971 Handbooks or as many as could be spared. Dr. Fairall had attended to this, and it was agreed that a charge of 40c each should be levied against Mr. Geary, observing that the published selling price is quoted at 50c.

(b) Some considerable time was devoted to his request that in view of the possible disbanding of the Planetarium Society, some 30 persons would possibly consider joining the Astronomical Society - if the Entrance Fee was waived. Coupled with this request was the suggestion that one Nomination Form should serve for a group entry. Council was very sympathetic, but study of the Constitution showed that the procedure for new members completing individual nomination forms and paying entrance fee would have to be followed. Agreed that the Secretary should inform Mr. Geary of Council's viewpoint and also forward to him 30 Nomination Forms.

(c) It was agreed that additional 10 copies of Sky and Telescope should be ordered for Mr. Geary. He would be liable for 40c per copy to the Society and to avoid any loss of possible potential members to the Society, the price to be charged should not be less than 50c per copy, which is the equivalent of R6 annual membership fee of the Society.

Handbook There were several points which Dr. Fairall wished to put before Council, but in view of the lateness of the hour it was agreed to defer discussion to the next meeting.

The Meeting closed at 10.30 p.m.
