Finance: Mr. Orpen, the Hon. Treasurer, presented the following financial statement. (see over)

Mr. Hurly had done a lot of good work in this direction, and Council expressed its appreciation. It was agreed that Mr. Hurly should have the official standing as'Public Relations Officer''. Naturally contact would be maintained with other Centres which may be particularly interested in a particular news item, also close liaison with S.A. Observatories would be necessary to avoid perhaps duplication of action, or encroachment on matters common to a particular observatory and the Astronomical Society. <u>Constitution</u>: A sub-committee consiting of Messrs Bondietti, Churms, Harding and Russo was appointed to consider any further possible amendments and report back at the next Council meeting. The sub-committee was requested to consider the incorporation of the Editor, Business Manager and Librarian as ex-officio members of Council. A letter received from Dr. Thackeray contained a degree of criticism at the method of appointing alternates to Council Members. It was agreed that the Hon. Secretary would reply to him on that point, in order to clear up some apparent misunderstanding. in Medal: Council wished to minute its congratulations to Mr. Bennett on ward to him by the British Astronomical Association. A suitable announcet would be appearing in MNASSA.

. Association for the Advancement of Science: The annual Congress would be d in Durban from 5th July to 10July 1971. The Society has been invited to ad a Representative, and this matter was raised by the Hon. Secretary with a Durban Centre, who appointed Mr. G. Hobson, with Mr. Booysen as a abstitute should the need arise, to represent the Society.

<u>'ublications-distribution-managing and editing</u>: Dr. Fairall, a non-member of Council, was undertaking the distribution of all publications and overseeing the composition of the Handbook, and had to make many urgent discussions on points frequently being raised at times when reference to Council was not practical. Formal approval for the responsibility exercised was given, as well as expression of appreciation for all the work put in on behalf of the Society. Council also wished to put on record it appreciation of the invaluable help given by Mr. Weinberg.

Dr. Fairall initiated a lengthy discussion on the subject, with particular reference to the Handbook. Possible improvements were mentioned and the increase in the numbers of pages by about 4-8 approved. It was hoped that a wider demand as a result of improvements envisaged would arise particularly among hooksellers. The incorporation of the Sun's altitude and azimuth at specific times and on specific dates was one suggestion made. Some criticism on the 1971 issue had been received; these would be borne in mind. A more attractive cover was also suggested, but any such change should be first considered at a Council Meeting.

Aggreed that in future Sky and Telescope should be addressed to the U.C.T. and not to the Royal Observatory as is the present practice.

<u>New Council</u>: Members were reminded that nominations for the Council 1971/ 1972 had to reach the Hon. Secretary by June 15.

<u>Recognition of the 60th Anniversary of the Cape Astronomical Association and</u> the 50th Anniversary of the Astronomical Society of South. Africa in 1972 was again raised. One suggestion was the organisation of a series of meetings on the basis of a Summer School at the University of Cape Town, with speakers of standing being invited to attend. Due to the lateness of the hour further discussion was left over until the next meeting which would be set for the 21st June.

The meeting closed at 10.45 p.m.
