It should be understood that this statement does not reflect the actual financial position at this date, as the accounts for the "Sky and Telescope" for July, August and September 1971 have not yet been paid, nor have the accounts from the University of Cape Town for production of Nos. 7 & 8, Vol. 30 of MNASSA been received. On the other hand, as shown, R900.00 has been transferred to the Savings Bank A/c since the beginning of the Financial Year. The amount in the Savings Bank A/c is now again R1000.00, in addition to the R1000.00 on Fixed Deposit with the United Building Society.

The balance in the McIntyre Award Account is now R554.21, interest amounting to R54.99 having been received during this month.

Dr. Wild remarked that to date sales of the back issues from Vol. 16 had exceeded slightly the cost of reproducing the issues, out of stock. With the prospect of further orders, there was every hope of attaining reasonable profit on this part of the scheme to meet the requests of Institutions who lacked a complete series of MNASSA. Regarding Volume 1 - 15, Dr. Wild reported that he now had available someone to re-type the stencils of selected extracts for a "pruned" series. A cost of R0.50 per page was envisaged but even with the added cost of duplicating, collating and despatching, it was considered that with the number of orders already received and orders anticipated the initial drain on Society funds would eventually be met.

50th and 60th Anniversaries relating to the Society: Dr. Wild reported that an informal self-appointed sub-committee had met during the last week, to consider replies and suggestions received with regard to the proposal to partake in the University of Cape Town Summer School. This is to be held early in the New Year. It had been necessary to meet the dead-line date asked for by the University of Cape Town, before the Council Meeting, and a tentative programme was drawn up, a copy of which is attached to these Minutes. Consideration of social events was left for the next meeting.

MNASSA: Dr. Fairall pointed out that disbursements by way of postage had increased enormously since the introduction of the recent revised postal tariffs. For example the postage on MNASSA to overseas institutions had increased from 1,1/2c to 7c per copy, amounting to approximately R100 per year. Resolved therefore that the subscription payable by non-members for MNASSA should be increased from R3 per annum to R4 per annum as from 1972 January.

Astronomy and the Press: Mr. Hurly raised the question of a periodic publication in the Press of star maps incorporating planetary movements. This had been done in the past in Cape Town but the practice lapsed several years ago. It was decided that before Council re-introduced this, on a local or country wide basis the Hon. Secretary should ascertain from up-country Centres whether any such publications were undertaken there.

Occultations: Mr. Harding expressed Council's appreciation of the work done by Mr. Hurly in organizing and publicising grazing occultations; in particular the recent one at Bloemfontein and the approaching one on September 25 on a path between Storms River and Port Edward. It was not clear to what extent the Director of the Occultation Section, resident in Rhodesia, was able to take note of events occurring at such a distance from Salisbury. There has been a quickening interest in this aspect of observational astronomy, and co-operation between all concerned was essential. Mr. Harding undertook to write Mr. Morrisby an informal letter on the subject of co-ordinating the efforts of all interested parties with liaison with overseas prediction agencies.

<u>Loan of Telescope:</u> An application had been received from Mr. M. Szapiro of 25 Weltrevreden Avenue, Rondebosch, Cape for the use of one of the Society's telescopes for observing occultations and variable stars. This was agreed to subject to the conditions laid down in Council Minutes of 1966 September 14.

S.A. Republic Observatory: Dr. Wild stated that fears had been expressed that with the inauguration of the new S.A. Astronomical Observatory action might be taken by the Authorities to close down, or curtail the work of the Republic Observatory in Johannesburg; which is internationally known for valuable work on double stars and minor planets. He suggested that Countil on behalf of the Society should make its views publicly known. The Hon. Secretary said that this matter should be considered by all full members of Council, who should, where applicable, convey their considered views to their alternates in time for the next Council Meeting on November 15. This was agreed. Alternates were to make early contact with their Principals.

There being no further business, the meeting closed at 10.20p.m. T. W. Russo
