<u>Finance</u>: Mr. Orpen presented the following financial statement, which was accepted by the Meeting. (see next page)

The question of the effect of the increased cost of Sky and Telescope on the finances of the Society was again discussed. It was agreed that any decision to increase subscription rates to offset the increased costs should be considered at the next Council Meeting. Agreed also that members who had paid in advance their dues before the announcement of an increase in the rates should not be called upon to pay the shortfall for that year. The question of foreign members paying the actual individual postage, which had now become considerable, should also be considered.

Sky and Telescope: New members joining during the months November and December; May and June should be given the option of delaying the effective date of joining until January 1 or July 1, saving a halfyear's subscription, as an alternative to joining from either of the two previous recognised dates. This latter course would mean a possibility of having to wait until copies of Sky and Telescope in short supply could be obtained from the USA.

With regard to surplus copies of old issues, Mr. Molyneux offered to try to dispose of some at public viewing nights at the S.A.A.O. Mr. Churms agreed to liaison with Mr. Molyneux with a view of disposing of those back issues which were accumulating.

Essay Competition: Members were reminded that at the end of the year consideration would have to be given to the selection of a suitable subject for the 1973 Forbes Essay Competition.

<u>Miscellaneous</u>: The contents of a communication received from Prof. Jarrett, acknowledging with thanks receipt of the Society's contribution towards the expense incurred by him in order to officiate at the presentation of the McIntyre Award was noted.

An application by Jair Barroso Junior of the National Observatory in Argentina to resume membership had been received. He had been removed from the membership role in 1964 through non payment of his subscription. Agreed that he could join from a current date provide a current subscription and an entrance fee were paid direct to the Society by a Bankers Draft on a South African Bank, and that regular payments were continued without delay and by the same means.

The contents of a letter received from Mr. Neser, Secretary of the Bloemfontein Centre was noted. Agreed that the Despatch Section should supply the names and addresses of member residing in the Orange Free State, and in addition it was suggested that members in the Kimberley area should be included.

Agreed that Council had no objection to the Bloemfontein Centre being known as the O.F.S. Centre, but it was pointed out that anomalies which do and have existed in other Provinces could arise in the future. For example there is the Transvaal Centre whose name embraces the whole Province with a Pretoria Centre in the same Province. There is also the Cape Centre in the Cape Province, although at one time there was a Port Elizabeth, also in the Cape Province. The Secretary was directed to embody these points in his reply to Mr. Neser.
