Further Business

- (a) The Hon. Secretary had received an application from the Natal Centre to become a member of the Society in order to receive Sky & Telescope, MNASSA and the Handbook for the Centre's library. As the Centre was "part and parcel" of the Society, obviously this proposal had no meaning. The issue of the Publications to the Centre at a fixed rate to cover cost was the obvious way to meet this application. No definite decision was taken in view of the pending discussion on the sub-committee's report on the future of MNASSA.
- (b) Mr Duveen of Pietermaritzburg spoke on the activities of the new Natal Midlands Centre, of which he was Council Representative.
- (c) A letter had been received from the Department of Physics, University of Natal, inviting the Society to join jointly with them in the 1975 Conference of the Institute of Physics. The date was provisionally fixed for July 7 - July 11. An offer to arrange a section devoted to Astronomy was made, and Society members would be welcome to participate in other activities of the Conference.

Council was pleased to receive this invitation; however it was pointed out that the Society was made up largely of amateurs, and any papers of a more serious technical nature would have a limited appeal to our members. The Hon. Secretary was directed to convey Council's sentiments to the Natal University and to ask for further details of the Astronomy section envisaged.

Future of MNASSA

A report on the findings of the sub-committee appointed to deal with this question was presented by Dr Wild, and a copy is attached to these minutes. This report was considered clause by clause, and as some of the proposals were of a far reaching nature, it was decided to adjourn the matter until the next meeting. In the meantime members of the Council not likely to be present at the next meeting by virtue of their living out of Cape Town would be asked to forward their comments to the Hon. Secretary as soon as possible. Alternates of Centre Representatives would consult their Principals on Clause 5 II of the Report, and report back at the next meeting.

Distribution of Sky & Telescope

A copy of the Report of the Sub-Committee appointed to consider this question is attached. This was duly read and noted. Mr Harding intimated that as a start the difficulty of delivering packets of Sky & Telescope from the Observatory Post Office to the University of Cape Town could be overcome, and he would arrange for means of transport as necessary. The other representations made were left with members for consideration.

It was asked that "Society equipment" should be included as an item on the Agenda for the next meeting.
