# ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY OF SOUTHERN AFRICA

Minutes of Council meeting held at the S A Astronomical Observatory, Cape Town on Monday 1977 February 7 at 8 p.m.

Minutes of the meeting held 1976 November 22, copies of which had been circulated were adopted.

### Matters Arising:-

Endowment Trust. Mr. Turk spoke on the progress made to date.

Matters were now nearing finality. He stated that the R200 mentioned in previous minutes as a possible donation to the Trust from the Natal Centre would not now be available.

McIntyre Award. The suggestion made at the last Council meeting to consider making awards of an international nature was debated. It was felt that paragraph 3 of the Appendix governing the conditions of the award covered this point.

Publication of lists of names of members. The Secretary reported that the Afric Mail Advertising Coy had quoted R28 to cut stencils from the details on addressograph plates. The Society would be able to run off lists in accordanace with requests received. It was pointed out that the stencils would deteriorate in course of time and also could not reflect the true current position. A suggestion was made that the plates in use at an appropriate date in the Society year should be impressed on foolscap sheets of paper and these be photocopied on request and charged to the member applying for the information. It was decided that the Hon. Secretary should ascertain the cost of getting details direct from the plates on to convenient size paper.

It was noted that Mr. J. Hers had agreed to act as Director of the Variable Star Section during Mr. Overbeek's absence in the U.S.A.

Agreed that in the case of Mr. Bilse the subscription should be waived during his absence on military service.

# Finance:-

Mr. Orphen presented the financial statement to date as appears at the end of the Minutes.

An estimate of the financial position which might be attained at the year end viz June 30 gave only a surplus of R400 of income over expenditure for the current year. This was in spite of the 50% increase in subscriptions. Mr. Orpen stated that foreign currency bank drafts were each subjected to a bank commission of 52c plus now an airmail charge of 50c. He was directed to query this with the Bank, also raising the feasibility of the Society operating a bank account in the U.S.A.

One case mentioned was that of Prof. Jarrett who distributed copies free to visitors to Boyden Observatory. Agreed that Prof. Jarrett and the Planetarium should only pay 80c per copy.
