Report of Council for the year ended 1978 June 30

Six Council meetings were held during the year with an average attendance of 12 members/alternates.

#### Membership

The total membership as at June 30 was 477 of whom 3.2. are still suspended for non-payment of their 1977/78 subscriptions. Comparative figures for 1977 June 30 are 533 with 50 suspensions. After the period of grace 4.4. were removed from the membership roll.

The inflow of new members has to a large extent compensated for the loss through suspension or resignation.

## Finance

In view of an anticipated loss over the year's transactions, Council felt compelled to recommend an increase in the annual rate of subscription from Rl2 to Rl5. This would be effective from 1978 July 1. As members have been informed in MNASSA the Society cannot escape from the general escalation in the costs of postage, printing, stationery etc. plus the increase in the price of "Sky & Telescope".

An amount of R1000-00 is on Fixed Deposit with the United Building Society at an interest rate of 10%. An amount of R500 was held in a "Plusplan" Savings Account with the Standard Bank, Heerengracht Branch at 30th June 1978. This amount varies according to requirements; during the first half of the Financial Year it was R2500-00. The interest rate is 8%.

The Society also stands possessed of four shares in the S.A. Permanent Building Society to a total value of R200-00, per Certificate C.15778, dated 18/5/1960, and of equipment and apparatus insured against fire under Policy A.Ol/Ol314, dated 27/2/1961, in the amount of R1000-00 with the Southern Insurance Association. The Society's telescopes are also insured against all risks under Lloyd's Policy no. DCP no. 278 with the firm of Hogg Robinson of Durban. The Centres which have telescopes on loan to them pay a pro rata share of the premium.

The balance in the McIntyreAward Account is now R1220-91 (of which R1000-00 is on Fixed Deposit with the United Building Society at an interest rate of 10%. There has been no award during the year.
