Minutes of Council Meeting held 1982 March 22 at 20h00 at the S A Astronomical Observatory, Cape Town.

- 1.) Present: Dr A Fairall in the Chair, Prof B Warner, Dr Cousins, Messrs Bondietti, Bentley, Hurly, Orpen, Simenhoff, Spencer-Jones, G and C Larmuth, Turk, Krumm, Miss Booth & Mrs FitzGerald.
- 2.) Apologies: for absence noted from Prof Baart, Dr Feast,

- 3.) Minutes: of the previous meeting held 1982 Feb.5, copies of which had been circulated, were taken as read and adopted.

4.) Matters Rising:

Sky and Telescope Distribution: Due to Mr Duveen's absence, the matter will be carried forward to the next meeting in June.

Gill Medal: The Secretary advised that Mr Overbeek has made the necessary arrangements and the presentation of the medal to Chris Papadopoulos by Prof Baart is to take place at the University of the Witwatersrand in Johannesburg on April 14.

Mr Gray requested that photos be taken of this event and sent to Sky and Telescope and MNASSA for publication.

Mr Spencer-Jones also requested the citation

List of Names & Addresses: Mr Hurly advised Council that Mr Gray does not want to be reimbursed for the list obtained from AMA and that the money be retained as a donation. Council expressed their thanks to Wr Gray for this donation and all his time and effort. Mr Gray is to advise the Hon. Treasurer of the exact amount.

However, Mr Spencer-Jones informed Council that the present print-out of names received contained many errors and should be thoroughly checked by two people before publication in MNASSA as a centre piece. It was agreed upon that the list be updated to date of publication, and that it should be published only once as the cost would be fairly high. Should Mr Gray be willing and

able, members wanting a more up to date list after publication, could obtain a copy from Mr Gray for a nominal fee.

Summary MNASSA Volumes: Dr Fairall was unable to report back fully, and the matter will be carried forward to the next meeting.

5.) Finance: Mr Orpen read the attached financial statement which Mr Hurly proposed should be accepted and this was seconded by Mr G Larmuth.

Mr Bondietti requested that Messrs Orpen and Turk look into the matter of reinvesting the monies on Fixed Deposit so as to realise better interest rates and returns.

## 8.) Correspondence:

The letter from Mr Barker was handed to Mr Turk who will contact him directly.

Mr. Turk will also contact Messrs Gray and Maasdorp regarding the P.E. People's Observatory becoming a Centre.

Mr Turk has traced and obtained the Panorama Magazine in which an article about astronomy and the ASSA appeared in Europe in several different languages and thus accounting for the sudden influx of overseas letters in foreign languages containing various requests. Dr Cousins suggested that a circular type letter be drafted and posted to these people, which Mr Turk kindly agreed to do.

Prof Warner also suggested that a general Society Brochure be produced for dissemination among interested people. Mr Bondietti asked that the Hon Secretary write a letter of thanks to the Editors of Panorama as the article, although misunderstood by the overseas readers, had given the Society much publicity.

Council noted with interest the letter written by Mr Wolterbeek regarding special classes for gifted children, and Mr Hurly requested the letter enabling him to inform the Cape Council on the Transvaal activities.

Council also noted with thanks the contents of a letter from Mr Hers concerning Variable Stars etc.

As Dr Feast was unable to attend the meeting, the election of a prominent amateur astronomer on the IAU Council will be carried forward to the next meeting. Council awaits the letter from Dr Hewitt to confirm this election.

#### 9.) Other Matters:

Mr Hurly advised that Mr Gray has mentioned that the Bloemfontein Centre is progressing very well and "getting into gear". Council noted this with great interest and expressed their good wishes and success.

The Chairman expressed concern regarding the amount of work Mr Orpen, the Hon. Treasurer, has to cope with at present, and asked for suggestions on how to alleviate some of the burden. Mr Turk proposed that a "Membership Treasurer" be appointed and with the help of Mr Gray computerise the membership list.
Mr Turk is to discuss the matter with Mr Gray and report back.

Mr Spencer-Jones showed Council neck ties for men with astronomical motives which could be obtained from the Taiwan and sold for plus-minus R5 - R6.

Mr Turk will approach the Trusteees of the Funds for their approval of embarking on this venture.
