Secretary should be increased to R25 p.m. (as an incentive for attracting a pensioner to take on the post). Council was divided on whether this should come from general funds or whether excess interest from the McKintyre award bequest should be used. No decision was taken.

M.N.A.S.S.A. Prof. Fairall suggested that an "administrative editor" for M.N.A.S.S.A. should be sought to relieve Mr. Churms of some of the work load. He offered to draft a letter to be sent to all members of the Society in the Cape Town area in this connection. Mr. Bondietti offered to include this in the forthcoming Cape Centre notice. Prof. Fairall would also try to send it to all other Society members in the area.
