The Hon.Secretary was requested to write to Dr.D.S.Evans, Dr.R.H.Stoy and Dr.P.A.T.Wild thanking them for their services to MNASSA and explaining the reasons for Council's decision to restructure the Editorial Board.

The Chairman expressed Council's thanks to Dr.I.S.Glass, Mr.J.Spencer Jones and Mr.L.Combrink for their willingness to edit MNASSA.

- (b) <u>Publication Dates</u> These would be discussed early in 1985.
- (ii) Minute No.4(iii) Stamps with an Astronomical Theme

Mr.J.Spencer Jones reported that South Africa would not be producing a set of stamps with an astronomical theme but that Ciskei would be issuing a set in 1986 to mark the return of Halley's Comet. He had supplied the relevant authorities with information on the comet and that the designs would be submitted to us for vetting in due course.

(iii) <u>Minute No.12</u>: Election of <u>Auditors</u> The names of Mrs.P.Kramer and Mr.L.Combrink had been accepted by the 1984 Annual General Meeting of the Society.

7. FINANCE

The Hon.Treasurer presented his Financial Statement, a copy of which is attached to these Minutes. The statementnwas adopted.

- It was noted that:-
- (1) The credit balance of R188-69 had been amalgated with R6050-00 in the Plusplan Account giving a total credit balance of R6238-69
- (2) It was agreed to transfer to transfer RIOCO in the McIntyre Award Account to the United Building Society on fixed deposit for 12 months at 18% thus bringing the total sum of the Award in the UBS up to R3000 on fixed deposit.
- (3) The Hon. Treasurer informed Council that the Society would show a deficit in income over expenditure by the end of June 1985, duc, mainly, to the effect of the unfavourable exchange rate of the Rand against the Dollar on the purchase price of Sky and Telescope. This led to a long and involved discussion. Although opinions differed as to the extent of the shortfall in revenue, it was clear that the Society was facing a financial crisis and that immediate and drastic action would have to be taken if a catastrophe were to be avoided.

It was decided to ask Mr.C.Turk to draw up a questionnaire to be sent to all members of the Society for their answers to one of the following alternatives :- Retain Sky and Telescope with a not inconsiderable increase in the subscription OR retain the present subscription and drop Sky and Telescope. The possibility was not overlooked that the final decision could have a profound effect on the membership of the Society. The Hon.Secretary to write to all the Centres informing them accordingly and asking them to discuss the matter with their members.
