Increase in Subscription (Minute No.4(iii)(3)
Eight members of Council were in favour of an increase in the subscription and three were against. Council accepted this as their mandate to discuss the amount by which the subscription should be increased.
The meeting proposed that the annual subscription be increased from R45 to R50 (fifty rand) as from 1986 July 1. The proposal would be announced through the medium of M.N.A.S.S.A. three months before the effective date of the change.

It should be made clear that the increase has been kept to an absolute minimum and will only just cover the increase in costs.

Purchase of SKY AND TELESCOPE on an agency basis: Minute No.4(iii)3(a) Agreed to inform SKY AND TELESCOPE that the Society would continue to purchase the magazine in terms of the present arrangement and not on an agency basis.
