ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY OF SOUTHERN AFRICA

Minutes of Council Meeting held on 1991 February 4 at 20h00 at S.A.A.O. Cape Town

1. PRESENT

Dr I.S.Glass, Vice-President, in the Chair. Miss P.Booth, Mrs A.Joubert, Mrs A.Strauss, Mrs E.Willis, Messrs P.Briton, A.D.B.Cameron, J.Churms, D.Duprez (Hon.Treasurer), R.Hurly and the Hon. Secretary H.E.Krumm.

2. APOLOGIES

Apologies for absence were received from Professor Brian Warner, Dr T. Lloyd Evans, Messrs J.Bondietti and M.G.Soltynski.

3. PRINCIPALS AND ALTERNATES

PRINCIPAL: It was noted that Mr K.Wade-Lehman had been appointed the Natal -Centre's Representative on Council. It is suggested that his name be inserted in the previous Minutes of Council.

ALTERNATE: Mr.J. Churms agreed to act as MR.A. Hilton's alternate on Council.

4. MINUTES

Minutes of previous meeting of Council held on 1990 November 26, copies of which had been circulated, were taken as read. It was proposed and seconded that be accepted as a reliable record of the proceedings. Confirmed and signed.

5. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

(i) MACLEAR'S BOTTLE: PLAQUES. Minute No.6(ii)

It was doubtless important that the text of the letter intended for Mr.George Hofmeyr, Director of the National Monuments Council, should be correctly worded. Mainly with this in mind, the Hon.Secretary discussed the matter of the plaques with him over the telephone. He expressed the opinion that the achievements of de la Caille and Maclear were of scientific and historical importence and should be commemorated in the manner suggested by Council. He requested that the wording on the plaques be drawn up by the sub-committee and submitted to him as soon as possible.

(ii) NATIONAL SYMPOSIUM ON ASTRONOMY: Minute No.6(iii)

As little or no progress had been made and time was running out, it was agreed to postpone the Symposium to 1992. It was recognised that the event as originally envisaged was perhaps just a little too involved and that consideration should now be given to a project of more manageable proportions. Mrs.E.Willis strongly advised that the programme should first be compiled before proceeding with the arrangements.

Arising out of a long discussion it is felt that the following proposals are worth recording as a start:-

- (1) The event should cater essentially for amateur astronomers.
- (2) That it be held at the South African Museum.
- (3) That it be held over a period of 2-3 days, possibly 3.
- (4) A visit to Sutherland might be considered.
- (5) Suggest to the Cape Centre that Council collaborate with them when arranging their 1992 Astronomy Week. That they be asked

to discuss the matter among themselves and that they inform Dr.I.S.Glass of their reaction to the suggestion as he was prepared to approach professional astronomers to take part in the proceedings.

6. FINANCE

The Hon. Treasurer, Mr D.Duprez, presented his statement of Income and Expenditure for the period 1990 July to 1991 January, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. After a hearty vote of thanks to Mr Duprez for his hard work, it was proposed by Mr.R.Hurly and seconded by Mrs.A. Strauss that the statement be adopted. All in favour.

The Hon.Treasurer pointed out that the present financial position was similar to that which existed at this time last year.

7. HONORARIA

The sub-committee consisting of Dr.T.Lloyd Evans, Mrssrs A.Cameron and R.Hurly would meet shortly to discuss the matter.
