ASSA NEWS

F N G ORPEN (1911 - 1997)

We are sorry to have to report the death on 17th September 1997 of Garrett Orpen, Treasurer of the Astronomical Society of Southern Africa for the enormously long period of 37 years (1950 to 1987).

Mr Orpen's father Redmund was member of the Cape Senate for Barkley West, retiring before the Union of South Africa was formed to farm in Griqualand West. Francis Newanham Garrett Orpen, to give him his full name, was born on 27th July 1911 on their farm Hilldown. He was named after Edmund Garrett, a former editor of the Cape Times and a friend of the family.

Garrett worked in the Local Accountant's Office of the South African Railways from the late 1930s until 1973. Besides his interest in astronomy he was a railway enthusiast. He was a founder member of the Western Cape Branch of the Railway Society of Southern Africa in 1961. He was also the treasurer of that society for many years as well as its chairman for a period. During his annual leaves he always took lengthy train journeys and kept detailed records of them.

Mr Orpen was never married. He was a rather frail person who nevertheless gave of his best to the causes in which he was interested, and ASSA was indeed fortunate to have been one of these. He was made an honorary life member of ASSA in 1981 and similarly of the Railway Society.

The funeral service was held at St James Church, Kenilworth on 22nd September, and was attended by several members of the Society who had known Mr Orpen for many years.
