WHO TO INTERVIEW? PRIORITY: ELDEST

- The oral history project is motivated to capture the lived experiences of our oldest living astronomers and those associated with astronomy in South Africa.
- We do want a cross sectional sample including all career stages, all ethnicities/races, all genders, all economic classes.
- We will allow for people who are not astronomers but telescope operators, engineers, etc.

COLLECTING INTERVIEWS SYSTEMATIC APPROACH

- Two Teams: Cape Town and Johannesburg
- Focus on Institutes and Departments: SKA, SAAO, AIMS, UCT, UWC, etc.
- 2-3 day visits
- dedicated room
- Who: Eldest (priority), recommended, and volunteers

PHYSICAL SETUP DEDICATED ROOM

- Quiet
- Well lighted
- Needs a door
- Either blank walls or visually interesting but not distracting
- The Scientists: Should wear solid colors
 - avoid white
 - non-reflective coating glasses

FILMING LIGHTING IS CRUCIAL

- carry a portable light source to illuminate from the front.
- 2 hours maximum promise 1.5 to 2 hours
- Get your subject to relax by doing chit chat while testing the equipment

EQUIPMENT CANON CAMCORDER

- XA 20 Cape Town
- XA 40 Johannesburg
- Voice recorder Johannesburg
- Cell phones Cape Town
- Lapel microphones if available
- 64 GB SD card for video
- >4 GB Mini-SD for voice recordings

Equipment Summary

- Everything charged
- Have backup batteries/backup chargers
- Check equipment and check again
- Lighting is important
- You phone is your friend

Record Keeping

- Have your own memory cards 64 GB each for camera and voice recorder/phone
- Organize the file system on your computer (show example)
- You are responsible for the files until they are uploaded onto our file servers.

What do we want to know?

- Dates, names, science, instruments, funding, networks, migrations
- BUT we want to learn their speaking style and the way they put information together on their own. Not just what they way, but how they say it.
- Semi-structured interviews
- Prompt Listen Cross-examine
- SILENCE IS YOUR FRIEND wait for answers. Do not use verbal reinforcement such as yes, yah, ahem, etc.

New Protocol

- Read CV/Resume, Go onto ADS to get highest cited article
- SPELL
- Background
- Education/Career
- Tastes
- Significance
- Life-work
- Religion
- South African Issues: Apartheid, Black Tax, Empowerment, Gender, Language
- Current Issues
- Advice

MEMORIZE THE PROTOCOL

- Memorize the protocol and the meanings behind each term
- It is not important the order of the topics FOLLOW THE CONVERSATION. It is okay to jump around. Just keep track of what still has to be covered.
- What if you do not touch on all the topics? It is OK. Just mention that you didn't get through everything and that you hope there will be a chance to do another interview to 'finish'
- Kleenex/Tissue this can be emotional. Show sympathy, stop equipment until they are composed again.
