Moulton,

I cannot thank you sufficiently for all the kindness and consideration I received at your hands when I gave my address at the end of last month. Let me only say they were much received by me.

I have also to thank you for your letter of the 28th June and feel well to the Committee for their action over the cost of the wasted

time was good enough to accept my suggestion that he should draw a resolution and ask me to draft one for his consideration and signature. I have accordingly done so and enclose it. If I send it to you in part because I am not sure of his address. Will you please be kind to let him have it at your convenience. I feel rather strongly that subject as you may infer. My idea is that the National Committee will be controlled by the Astr. Soc., outside members should be co-opted - the Minister for the Interior might be one or he should nominate someone for one or three years - the President of the A.S. and the President of the U.A. should each also appoint a member which members of themselves. The Union Astronomer and perhaps the Director of the Survey should also hold office ex-officio - and the number might be set up to 9 by selection from and by your Committee. These are my suggestions.

The main thing is to form a real live National Committee which shall be true interest of Astronomy at heart and be sufficiently influential to carry weight with the Government if necessity should arise. It would be well to try and fix the dates upon which the committee meet, perhaps one date a year officially and others if necessary. It will be an understood thing that the Union Astr. should present or even be charged with drawing up the report of the committee.

I have in my mind a sort of Board of Visitors - modified to fall in with notions of the Union.

I'd also like to see the Astronomer on the A.S. Committee and my brother, entitled (and invited) to take part in our deliberations - not entitled to vote - this for obvious reasons.

I'm afraid that I am asking rather a lot from you and yourself to the Committee of the A.S. Astr. Soc. - but as I have already said my heart strongly on the subject and do wish to avoid astronomical discussion in A.S. frienship. So please excuse if possible my verbosity and troubling you and with every good wish

ing now: (1) That in the opinion of this committee, a South African National Astronomical Committee should be formed as an integral part of International Astronomical Union, and recommends the formation of this Committee to the Minister for the Interior.

(2) It further suggests that the personnel of this Committee be constituted as follows :-

- (i) The Minister for the Interior or a person appointed by him.
- (ii) The President of the Royal Soc. of ... and of the Afr. Assoc. for the Adv. of Science or persons appointed by R.A.S.A. ex-officio.
- (iii) The Union Astronomer and a Director of the Observatory ex-officio.
- (iv) Persons to be appointed by the Committee of the Astr. Soc. of ...

(3) This Committee notes with satisfaction that the Union is already an adherent to the Int. Astr. Union.
