Dear Mr. Long.

I enclose proofs of the Journal arranged in order for the printer to page, together with list of contents and index to be set in type. The paged proof should be accompanied by pulls of the blocks, with the appropriate legends set in type.

Including index, the matter appears to run to about 50 pages, though it is difficult to tell with any certainty as the proofs have had to be re-arranged so much. By judicious spacing, the printer can doubtless spread the matter out somewhat and so avoid leaving a double blank page at the end.
