There is a matter which I should like brought forward or consideration at the next Council Meeting, arising out of the lection of Prof. Schlesinger as a member of the Society. The ostibility of members permanently residing outside South Africa is apparently not considered when the Constitution was framed. I own view is that such members can not be considered as a blonging to any branch or cantre of the Society, and that ibscriptions from such members should go wholly to Headquarters, or the advancement of the general intoreats of the Society. I we no doubt that that was what was in the mind of Prof. Itselfager when he was proposed for election. I have read arough the Constitution end I can not see anything in it which equins the view that I have taken.
