ASTRONOMICAL SOCIETY OF SOUTHERN AFRICA

Minutes of Council Meeting held on 1988 February 15 at 20h00 at S A A O Cape Town

1. PRESENT

The President, Mr J H Spencer Jones, in the Chair. Dr I S Glass, Miss P Booth, Mrs A Joubert, Mrs E Olsen (Hon. Treasurer), Messrs J Bondietti, J Churms, R Hurly, F N G Orpen (Membership Secretary), C R G Turk and the Hon. Secretary H E Krumm.

2. APCLOGIES

Apologies for absence were received from Professor A P Fairall, Professor Brian Warner, Dr T H H Lloyd Evans, Messis P Briton, A D B Cameron and W L Combrinck (Business Manager).

3. PRINCIPALS AND ALTERNATES ON COUNCIL (see Min. No.) of previous Council Meeting) Mrs P A Ross of the Natal Centre had now joined the Society and was therefore eligible to represent that Centre on Council. Two members of the Society attached to the Cape Centre, Messrs M Lyons and H L N Scoble, were prepared to act as alternates.

4. MINUTES

Minutes of previous meeting of Council held on 1987 November 30, copies of which had been circulated, were taken as read. Their adoption was proposed by Mr J Churms and seconded by Mr R Hurly. Confirmed and signed.

5. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

- (i) CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION (Minute No.5 (ii)
 - (a) McIntyre Award Council agreed that the Constitution be amended in accordance with Mr C R G Turk's recommendation.
 - (b) Long Service Award Mr Turk agreed to draw up an addendum to the Constitution in connection with this Award.

A combined ballot paper would be sent to all full members of the Society, replies to be received by 1988 August 1. The ballot paper would accompany the usual subscription notice despatched to members. (A copy of the ballot paper is attached to the minutes of this meeting in the Minute Book)

(ii) FORBES BEQUEST: COMPETITION 1988 (Minute No.5 (iii)

It was announced that the S A Museum News Letter and, hopefully, ARCHIMEDES would publicise the Competition. It was noted with appreciation that the Trustees of ASSET would meet the cost of the copy of Norton's Star Atlas presented at last year's Competition.

(iii) NATIONAL ASTRONOMY WEEK . (Minute No.5 (iv)

(a) FUTURE EVENTS

Council decided that a National Astronomy Week be held every three years, the next to take place in 1990. It was also agreed to suggest to the Centres that they consider holding an Astronomical Week during each of the intervening years, it being left to the individual Centres to decide on the most suitable times when such an event might be held, depending on projected weather conditions etc.

(b) NATAL MUSEUM

Mr P F Tempest, Chief Exhibition Officer of the Natal Museum at Pietermaritzburg had written to say that the Museum would be interested in participating in the next National Astronomical Week. It was agreed to refer his letter to Mr J W Watson of Pietermaritzburg with a request that he take the matter further with Mr Tempest.

6. FINANCE

(1) FINANCIAL STATEMENT

The Hon. Treasurer, Mrs E Olsen, presented her Financial Statement dated 1988 February 11, a copy of which is attached to these minutes. Its adoption was proposed by Mr R Hurly and seconded by Mr J Churms. All in favour. It was noted that an amount of R10626 would be required to balance the books as at 1988 June 30. The Hon. Treasurer expected a shortfall of R1600 of income over expenditure.

(2) INCREASE IN SUBSCRIPTION: R50 to R60 as from 1988 July 1

Five Centres replied. Four agreed to accept the increase as ""..unfortunate but obviously necessary in the light of projected shortfall"; "..the benefits and periodicals received are well worth the value of the proposed increase"; "..the Society has no option other than to increase the subscription to at least R60 per annum"; "...feel that the majority of our members will understand the situation and will remain loyal to the Society". The fifth Centre mentioned that they gain very little benefit from SKY AND TELESCOPE and that the advantages gained from this periodical are not quite worth the money we have to pay for it. Their reply amounted to a negative vote.

(The above are abstracts from the replies received)
Two Centres did not reply.

After a brief discussion it was proposed from the Chair that the subscription be increased from R50.00 to R60.00 per annum as from 1988 July 1. It was clear that this step was unavoidable due to increasing costs and that it was supported by the majority of the Centres. The proposal was unanimosly accepted and confirmed by the meeting.

8. "SOUTHERN ASTRONOMY"

A communication dated 1988 January 13 was received from Mr J M Mally the Editor of a new journal called SOUTHERN ASTRONOMY which was shortly to be produced and published in Australia. It would be dedicated to reporting southern news and events to southern astronomers, both amateur and professional. The subscription would be 55 Australian dollars which is equivalent to R87 per annum, air mail postage included.

The publishers would like to send a free copy of the first issue to be published on 1988 March 24 to all members of ASSA. For this purpose they would require a copy of our mailing list. Council agreed to this request in the light of their assurances the names would not be given to third parties and that the list would be destroyed once this intial mail-out was complete.

9. HANDBOOK

The Editor, Mr R Hurly, reported that the information regarding occultations on pages 36 to 38 of the 1988 edition of the Handbook was incorrect. He would supply the correct data to interested persons on request. He mentioned that the S A Museum had taken 100 copies of the Handbook.

10. M.N.A.S.S.A.

Agreed to sell copies of MNASSA to Professor A H Jarrett of the Boyden Observatory at the University of the Orange Free State at R3.00 per copy. Dr I S Glass would determine the wholesale price of MNASSA.

11. NATIONAL COMMITTEE OF THE INTERNATIONAL ASTRONOMICAL UNION

The Society's representative on this Committee, Mr D.Overbeek, reported that he had attended a meeting of the Committee on 1988 February 2. He mentioned that a new Committee will be formed during 1988 and that the Society would be invited to nominate a representative or to provide a short list of nominees who are members of the IAU. Mr Overbeek was in favour of rotating the post. Mr J C Bennett was his predecessor on the Committee. The matter to be discussed at next Council meeting.

12. MEMBERSHIP SECRETARY

Mr F N G Orpen was finding it increasingly difficult to cope with the duties of Membership Secretary and requested Council to relieve him of his duties by the latest 1988 June 30. There was a possibilty that Mrs A Joubert would be prepared to take over from Mr Orpen with whom she would discuss the matter.
