	Comms	3.1 Centre Chair and Section Director Updates
		Reports were received from Deep Sky, Cosmology and Instrumentation Directors,
		Garden Route Centre, Cape Centre Newsletter and are attached to the minutes.
		P de Villiers confirmed - when asked by E Nijeboer - that the reports are requested before
		each Council meeting, thus ~ every two months. C Rijsdijk noted how he envies the talks
		listed in the Cape Centre Newsletter.

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<u>P de Villiers</u> offered to provide a draft format for the reports.

# **3.2 ASSA President visits to Centres**

P de Villiers said he would be able to visit the KZN Centres, ~ 5 May or 30 June, Garden Route ~ end May/early June, Bloemfontein ~ June and will liaise further with the Chairs of these Centres.

He noted key comments from his visits to date to the Cape and Gauteng Centres: the common denominators for success of ASSA are the Centre Chairs, they are precious resources. In addition to the visits to date, the Centre reports have provided valuable further information about the Centres activities.

He re-iterated his intent to draft a report on ASSA in due course once the visits have been completed which will give overview of all ASSA and astronomy related activities in Southern Africa.

# 3.3 Outreach

**3.3.1 SKA Outreach** (24 Nov) <u>P de Villiers</u> offered to send email to L Raynard on an initiative for educational outreach (workshop to enrich the DOE curriculum). (23 Feb) a date has been set with the circuit manager for four workshops for science teachers and a trial run with 600 Gr 6 learners.

P de Villiers reported that he has spoken to Wendy Colleyn and a workshop is planned for 27 April to discuss detail of the workshop for Science Teachers in the Overberg.

C Rijsdijk informed that the ex-SciFest Director (with whom he has worked for a long time) is now with SKA - Outreach and is a valuable entry point for ASSA.

C Rijsdijk raised concern that he is aware that individuals have approached the SKA on behalf of the ASSA and this could be seen as a conflict of interest. The meeting agreed with the principle he stated: if anyone is interested in approaching the SKA in the name of ASSA, it has to be done via the ASSA Council.

# 3.3.2 Other Outreach

P de Villiers noted:

- Successful event with the Overberg Home Schoolers ( $\sim 65$ )
- Hermanus is building a full scale model of the Solar System along a pathway at Hemanus and students are helping with the construction.

# **3.4 ASSA Publications - SGAS**

A Slotegraaf confirmed that his agreement with ASSA for SGAS 2017 was not yet formalised. P de Villiers asked <u>AJ Nel</u> (in absentia) to finalise.

Ideas for SGAS 2017: Consider including list of contacts that public can contact for Outreach activities:

Closing date for SGAS input: Images / minor amendments: late July / Early August: Substantial text: end June

SGAS Competition:

The Finance Sub Committee to consider if funds can be made available for another competition.

A Slotegraaf noted that his view is that the purpose of the competition is "buying awareness creation". He will analyse the responses received.

Outcomes from 2016 Competition to consider learning for possible next time:

ASSA COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES If there is another Competition, Struik will again be asked to help with marketing. Method of entry will be reviewed to see if it can/should change from postal only entries. Non-postal entries are dependent on using an unique number per entry. Marketing: Centres should be asked to include marketing in their communication to their members. 3.5 ASSA Publications – MNASSA and/or Editorial Board **Book Review Editor:** C Rijsdijk informed Council that he is looking for someone to perform the role of Book Review Editor. Everyone to consider and forward nomination/s to C Rijsdijk. Some of the principles used in the past were that the Book Review Editor could approach publishers for a book to review or ASSA would be requested to fund a new book for review. It was suggested that a request could be sent to the ASSA mail lists (C Rijsdijk). Centre Chairs could also put out requests for reviews (as is done by the Cape Centre) to be sent to C Rijsdijk to include in MNASSA. Latest edition MNASSA: C Rijsdijk informed that the May edition will be on the website before the end of April and extended his appreciation to I Glass for his contribution. P de Villiers extended thanks to C Rijsdijk for his excellent effort with MNASSA. MNASSA General: A Slotegraaf specifically noted his appreciation to C Rijsdijk for his effort on MNASSA and re-iterated his view on the importance of the publication being the journal and record of astronomical events in South Africa. P de Villiers agreed to send a note to Centre Chairs to ask for their support in contributing content to the MNASSA publication and to inform their members on how to obtain MNASSA via the ASSA website and notification via the mail list. C Rijsdijk noted that there is an article by C de Coning in the next edition of MNASSA covering how the ASSA Archive works which should make for interesting reading. 3.6 Website Outreach on the website: C Rijsdijk suggested that should anyone (the Public) want to have some sort of outreach activity, there should be a contact on the website where people can request such a visit/activity for a club/school group etc. A Slotegraaf confirmed the principle agreed was that Section Directors are responsible for keeping information current and relevant under their pages on the website and thus J Smit was asked for his contribution to update the Outreach page. <u>L Cross</u> to convene a telecom session with the relevant contributors to the website to discuss: Section Directors to keep their pages active and current on the website. Specifically the Outreach page should include contributions from Centres, ASSA Members, etc;

- Dates information: review where data should be kept up to date by whom else be removed;

P Dormehl noted that the ASSA website when going onto MNASSA page shows a 2013 date. This was discussed and A Slotegraaf offered to fix it straight away (meeting thanked

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		Auke).
