	Facebook = 16.0 million (about 30% of the population)
	Twitter = 8.0 million
	LinkedIn = 6.1 million Instagram = 3.8 million
	Interestingly, of the Facebook users, a whopping 14 million access the site from their
	mobile devices.
	Age wise, 2.1 million FB users are 13-18.
	This website
	https://www.statista.com/statistics/558248/number-of-facebook-users-in-south-africa/
	suggests that by 2022 there will be almost 22 million FB users.
	Not counted in the above, is the number of YouTube users. This total must be staggering. YT in particular is a popular hangout for the younger demographic.
	And truly staggering must be the number of people who search for something they are not
	familiar with, using Google.
	If ASSA wants to reach the general public via the Internet, then it's clear the website must
