		3.2 Website <i>Permanent item: <u>Section Directors and Centre Chairs</u> to ask John Gill to effect any change to their pages on the website if they cannot do it themselves.</i> No updates reported.
		3.3 Update/Comments from Centres and Section Directors <i>Permanent item: Section Directors and Centre Chairs</i> Auke reminded <u>Centre Chairs</u> to please look at their info on pages 116, 117 in the Sky Guide and send updates to him, asap (copy L Cross, J Gill).
		3.4 Other Astronomical Societies / Affiliations <u>Permanent item</u>
		3.4.1 African Astronomical Society ("AfAS") https://www.africanastronomicalsociety.org Information received via email or whatsapp group set up by AfAS (for amateur astronomy associations in Africa) to "discuss events, plan common activities and share resource material", is being shared by L Cross via the assavip mail group.
		3.4.2 Botswana Astronomical Society Gihan Ilangakoon shared an invite on assavip mail group, to a virtual presentation they arranged in collaboration with the Botswana International University of Science and Technology on the origins of the Motopi Pan meteorite found by a team of international scientists, including Tim Cooper (ASSA Specialist in Asteroids, Meteors, Comets) in the Central Kalahari Game Reserve.
		"Tracing Motopi Pan to its source in the Asteroid Belt" was presented by Peter Jenniskens, the lead author of the paper of the comprehensive scientific work in the prestigious Meteoritics and Planetary Science Journal. C Stewart noted that the virtual presentation was very interesting and well received.
		3.5 ASSA Communication Coordinator (24 May) ASSA to establish a role to facilitate the productive use of ASSA's communication means and mechanisms in support of ASSA's principles noted in the Constitution. A call to be sent out for volunteers (<u>L Cross</u>). L Cross noted progress has been made but not yet concluded.
		3.6 Letter for your neighbourhood and Dark Sky Section (8 June) From Oleg Toumilovitch to ASSA-Discussion on 30 March 2020: The idea is to compile a 1-A4 page document, formally undersigned by ASSA, which would highlight an importance of keeping outside lighting of houses to the minimum and importance of correct installation of lighting devices. (15 Feb) Council agreed that this item be included in the scope of the previous item. To be dealt with by the incoming Communications Coordinator.

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	Ischua	3.7 Communication from Centres and Section Directors, to Country/Hon Members
		 (25 May) It was agreed invitations to a broader group than ASSA members is up to the organiser of the event. A mail group for Country/Hon Members to be established to receive updates/invites aimed at ASSA members (<u>C Stewart, L Cross</u>). C Stewart, who set up the assavip mail group, noted 68 members have signed up thus far. The group includes Centre Chairs who are welcome to share info with their members.

		3.8 2018 ASSA Symposium Presentation (15 Feb) Auke appealed to the meeting for help with the videos he recorded at the 2018 ASSA Symposium, 26 presentations. Ideally, these should be edited into YouTube and then placed on the ASSA YouTube Channel. Alison Coulter kindly offered assistance. A Coulter informed that completion in near for her to forward to Auke. Auke expressed his appreciation which is shared by everyone.

		4.1.1 An e-version (15 Feb) SGAS "marketing" – including for e-version - to be on website (<u>Auke, J Gill</u>) AJ advised an e-version option will be in place for the 2022 edition, details are being finalised with Struik eg pricing and distribution.
		 4.1.2 SGAS 2021 - distribution (25 May) A survey was requested to be sent to all Country and Hon Members to enquire if they have received their SGAS for 2021. (AJ Nel, C Stewart). Options for delivery of 2022 edition to be finalisation at the next meeting. (Council) C Stewart sent request to all Country and Members, asking if they were still awaiting their SGAS 2021 and AJ Nel remailed editions. C Stewart expressed his sincere thanks to AJ for the herculean effort in following up and resending copies to Country and Hon Members.
		4.1.3 SGAS 2022 – price and delivery option to Country Members <u>AJ Nel</u> advised the price, excluding delivery to Country members (bulk delivery to Centres is handled by Struik) will be increased, slightly, expected to be R85, but will be confirmed.
		Delivery options to still be finalised by <u>AJ</u> and discussed / confirmed by the <u>FSC</u> . A Coulter noted that ASSA Johannesburg is satisfied with their delivery offering. i.e. optional additional R50 if Members would like their SkyGuide to be couriered to them via PUDO.
		4.2 MNASSA (25 May) <u>C Rijsdijk</u> reported that he and Dr I Glass agreed to introduce a new section for Centre News in MNASSA and will solicit input for content from the Centres. C Rijsdijk noted the request to <u>Centres</u> to provide him with a regular summary of Centre highlights which could be considered to place in MNASSA.
		4.3 Nightfall (15 Feb) "Nightfall articles turn up on a Google search originate from <u>ISSUU.COM</u> web page, not from the ASSA's link to that page." (<u>C Stewart, D Bullis, L Cross</u>)

Discussions / Decisions / Actions (in bold)(25 May) The Nightfall link on the website https://assa.saao.ac.za/about/publications/ connects to D Bullis' ISSUU.com web page. Nightfall editions to be similarly handled as with those of MNASSA. It was agreed to take the proposal further with the SAAO in the first instance to confirm how it could be implemented. (L Cross). Council agreed that if require a donation could be made to the SAAO for the hosting space on their servers.The Nightfall Editions links are now on the ASSA website https://assa.saao.ac.za/sections/deep-sky/nightfall/ Doug expressed sincere thanks on behalf of everyone to SAAO and Christian and to John for getting the links to Nightfall onto the ASSA website. He encouraged everyone to explore the guidelines on the top of the page which guides one on how to peruse issues before downloading. 4.4 Other Astronomy related publications
 (15 Feb) ASSA could potentially support further Astronomy related publications. (24 May) <u>AJ Nel offered</u> to prepare guideline recommendation for the FSC to consider in the first instance before taking it to Council. Still in progress.
 5. Scholarships Permanent item: R20 000 per scholarship in 2020 for ASSA Scholarship and Cooke Scholarship. Scholarships for 2021 is suspended. (24 May) At the FSC held 20 May, AJ Nel reported R40 000 was withdrawn from the Fund in prep of 2022 Scholarships. <u>C Flanagan</u> received confirmation to place advert for 2022 bursaries on the website. <u>AJ</u> will confirm the sum available. The Scholarships Committee decides the bursars; <u>Clare</u> will inform further detail in due course.

Governance 7.1 Register ASSA for tax under a VDP (Voluntary) Application (27 Nov 19) Proposal by CTF Services (below the agenda) was accepted: "bold highlighted portions seem to be missing from the constitution". AJ Nel undertook to compile a draft update to the Constitution and if approved ratified at the next AGM. (21 Sep) AJ Nel confirmed that the draft amendments to the Constitution was sent to CTFS for sign off before presenting to Council and finalising the document. (15 Feb) AJ Nel informed the process is being run in parallel with finalising the 2020 financials. (24 May) <u>AJ Nel</u> reported the item is in progress with SARS <u>AJ</u> reported 2021 financials is finalised to CTF Services. 2020 and 2021 financials will be submitted in support of tax registration. 7.2 AGM 2020 wrap up and 2021 C Stewart thanked B Olivier for arrangements and C Foster for hosting the handover of

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		 the two Overbeek Medals (to Magda Streicher and Clyde Foster), see details in MNASSA. In support of item 7.1 23.3.3 APPROVAL OF PBO

Section 30 which gives the Commissioner the right to approve a public benefit organisation for the purposes of the Act provides that the Commissioner will approve such an organisation if

• it complies with such conditions as the Minister may prescribe

• it has submitted to the Commissioner a copy of its constitution, will or other written instrument under which it has been established in terms of which it is:

- required to have at least three unconnected persons to accept fiduciary responsibility

- prohibited from directly or indirectly distributing any funds to any person (otherwise than in the course of any public benefit activity) and is required to utilise its funds solely for the objects for which it has been established

- required on dissolution to transfer its assets to a section 30(3)(b)(iii) organisation (see below). In the case of a branch or agency of an association incorporated and tax exempt in another country, it can also distribute the assets of the organisation to any other person provided that those assets were acquired from a source outside the Republic

- is prohibited from receiving any donation which is revocable at the instance of the donor
- required to submit to the Commissioner any amendments to its constitution

• the Commissioner is satisfied that it is not knowingly party to a tax-avoidance scheme

- it has not paid remuneration to any employee, office bearer, or member which is excessive
- it complies with reporting requirements determined by the Commissioner

Note that a PBO no longer has to be registered in terms of the Non-Profit Organisations Act (Act 71 of 1997) to qualify for tax exemption, but, the Director of Non-Profit Organisations as defined in that Act can request the Commissioner to withdraw the approval of any PBO if it has been convicted of any offence under the Act.
