His report looked back on the year and highlighted activities by the various Sections within the ASSA. He reported the Overbeek Medal Awards awarded for both 2020 and 2021 at the previous AGM were formally handed over to the recipients at a small gathering at "Clyde's Spot" (aka Clyde Foster's home).

5	Financial and Membership Report	 5. Financial and Membership Reports 2020 21 5.1 Financial Report The report for the 2020 21 was presented by AJ Nel and the summary is available on the website. Some key points noted: Income derived from royalties decreased substantially due to reduced SkyGuide sales and a continuous downward trend is expected in the upcoming year. Sanlam Glacier came into its own in 2021, and capitalization of growth will be done annually to provide for the payment of bursaries. (Investment growth 57%). The goal of cutting of expenses was achieved with around R 30 000 in expenses being cut, eg travel expenses. The outlook given was that bar for projects and bursaries, no substantial expenses are foreseen for the 2020/2021 year. 5.2 Country Membership report AJ Nel reported: There are currently 118 country members compared to 127, 142 country members in two preceding years. 13 new country members joined the Society during the current period, compared to 4 in the preceding year. Country membership renewal fee cost for the 2021/22 year will be set at R100 due to increased postage cost. The entry fee remains at R50.

		From Vesta to the Kalahari: tracing meteorites from asteroid 2018 LA On 2 June 2018, asteroid 2018 LA crashed into the atmosphere resulting in a spectacular bolide and deposited meteorites on the ground. The scientific results of the study were recently published by 66 authors in Meteoritics and Planetary Science. Tim will show the processes followed to calibrate video footage to determine the fall location, determine the light curve of the bolide, and the October 2018 search expedition which found 22 fragments of 2018 LA.
		Tim kindly took some questions from the audience and Chris noted in conclusion that "it was a fascinating account and it highlights once again how pro-am collaboration is alive and well in the world of Astronomy".
