Highlights from the report: Net loss is down to -R7 510,21 Comparative income slightly higher; Income derived from most sources remained stable; Sanlam Glacier continued a steady growth and the first withdrawal for bursary payment was done in 2023; SkyGuide sources, contributing the most to income, was up - as were Sabinet Royalties and Membership fees; Expenses in general were on par with 2023; Accountant fees spike now and again as CTFS only charge every 2 or so years; No major expenses are foreseen for the 2024-2025 financial year. The meeting approved the following: Country membership renewal fee for 2024/25 will remain at R150 (which includes the delivery options of either via PAXI or PUDO) as approved by Council at the meeting of 24 June. The entry fee remains R50. Independent Compiler, Peter Carlisle of CTFS, to remain Independent Compiler for ASSA. Note: his Auditing business is independent of the normal bookkeeping and tax work done by CTF services for the ASSA.
