3.2.2 Join Us top menu item on website

(19 Feb '24) Daniel explained that he would like a streamlined interface for people to join ASSA via the website. (11 Mar) Auke created top menu item, <u>Join Us</u> on website, which would lead visitor to start engagement with ASSA. Auke was unable to edit/create a new Form and called on <u>Christian</u>/SAAO IT to make changes requested. Christian informed that SAAO IT recommended to resolve the Join Us and Captcha issues, a plug-in Updraft is needed for migrating the website to a WordPress single-site set-up at the SAAO.

Christian confirmed the plug in/migration will have no implications of the site ASSA website URL. Daniel reconfirmed the requirement is 100% necessary. No objections were received and the request for the expense of 190 USD for Updraft once off license fee will be finalised by the <u>FSC</u>.

Jacques asked if the website will be able to track stats such as the visitor count to the site. Christian confirmed that he can arrange Google Analytics to be set up by SAAO IT.

3.2.3 Sending email to all Members

(19 Feb '24) Daniel requested and received Centres' support to establish a single mail list to enable him to communicate key requests /information to all ASSA members, e.g. notification of the AGM.

(11 Mar) Daniel said it would be good to have the process implemented for next year's sign up starting in July. Council noted the proposal for implementing an ASSA Member List sent to Council on 5 April.

Bloemfontein and Durban Centres have already informed support for the proposed process and Daniel reminded that at the recent Centres' meeting, Johannesburg Centres also supported it.

Case informed that the Garden Route Centre members did not support the process and the Centre Chair will remain responsible for forwarding relevant emails to the Centre's members.

<u>Lerika</u> to follow up with <u>Christian</u> (Cape Centre) and <u>Andre</u> (Country Membership). Implementation will now be progressed.

3.3 Website

An item outstanding since closure of the website review: reactivating the "Search" function (<u>Christian</u>) Christian asked for clarity of the requirement (<u>Lerika</u>).

3.4 ASSA Cloud repository

(11 Mar) <u>Centres</u> to inform Chris de C that they've implemented a process to upload data to their cloud space. <u>Chris de C</u> informed he will check which Centres has accessed their space and will then start contacting the Centres in couple of weeks and will work with them to get all onboard with placing their data in the cloud.

3.5 Mutual beneficial relationships

Lerika noted Chris Middleton (a previous active ASSA Director and recipient of President's Award 2006) who relocated to Plettenberg Bay, started the Plettenburg Bay Astronomy Club in April.

3.6.1 Astro Tourism

(4 Oct) DSI Astro Tourism Strategy Plan: final plan to be presented following which funding will be known. Funding is likely to be dependent on ASSA being registered as a PBO.

4 4. Outreach

4.1 Pamphlet/Flyer

(23 Oct) Flyer to be downloadable from website, to print (A4 or A5, back-to-back) as handouts at events (19 Feb '24) Daniel stressed Outreach is a key cornerstone of ASSA, an objective stated in ASSA's constitution. Daniel proposed the Flyer as an outreach tool. This will raise profile of ASSA, attract new members, and support his goal to grow the community.

(11 Mar) Further to Daniel obtaining the quote to spruce up the draft Flyer and its approval by the FSC, the Flyer is now available in pdf (attached) and pptx versions.

Council was asked to note the proposal "<u>ASSA Flyer Guidelines 240409</u>" sent to Council on 9 April. Daniel encouraged everyone to download the Flyer from the Outreach page https://assa.saao.ac.za/outreach/ and print and make it available at publics events.

The guidelines suggested that an Astrophotography Challenge is held each year which will have the winning photo/s on the Flyer for the next year. Daniel proposed that if no objections are received the initiative should proceed. (Martin, , Chris S, Lerika)

4.2 Sky Guide as an Outreach tool

(11Mar) Daniel again noted the importance of getting the Sky Guide out there and use it as a tool to attract members and suggested a discussion at the next meeting to share some ideas. <u>Council Members</u> to prepare some options of how they can use the Sky Guide in support of Outreach. <u>AJ</u> to share the latest Sky Guide pricing discounts for bulk purchases. Ian said he has some 2023 Sky Guides available and anyone interested may contact him. (All)

For everyone to understand the implications of purchasing the Sky Guide in bulk, the latest bulk purchase pricing from AJ is awaited (AJ)

Initiatives of how to use the Flyer as an Outreach tool will be taken further via email (Lerika) – and suggested included in the Comms doc for safe keeping.

4.3 Recent Outreach activities

Jacques informed via ASSAVIP of the outreach event at the University of Free State in Bloemfontein on 27 March to the Dept of Physics to first-year students on the complex connection between the Solar Activities and the Earth's Climate. He noted between 30 to 40 students and lecturers attended and good feedback was received – the report is available on <u>Solar Section page</u>.

Jacques also informed he held an online solar observation class with 2 organisations in India attended by 52 students. He is writing a report on that which will be shared with ASSAVIP group and also be posted on the website.

Daniel reminded everyone to send outreach activities to Council and to place it on the Centre or ASSA website.

4.4 ASSA GMN Outreach Project (https://globalmeteornetwork.org/outreach/)

The ASSA GMN Outreach Project initiated by Tim early 2023, and well supported by Pierre, has reached its implementation phase at the Touwsrivier Primary School and Laingsburg High School.

Tim confirmed the schools' IT departments are still to connect the Raspberry Pi computers to the internet before commissioning can take place. Thereafter Tim will arrange an online intro lecture with the 2 schools as well as 2 schools in Hermanus and Gansbaai, to explain meteors and the importance of and how to include the topic in the curriculum.

The <u>link to the 3 components of the Astronomy Module</u> which Tim contributed to, must still be posted on the <u>Outreach page (John)</u>

The Astronomy module includes: 1. Introduction to Astronomy, 2. Introduction to optics and telescopes, 3. Navigating the night sky and 4. Meteor science. Module 2-4 completed by Mary McIntyre and Tim are now online. Tim volunteered to write the Intro to Astronomy tutorial in order to complete the Astronomy Module. The modules on Computer Science and GMN will be completed by other authors.

The refund request of costs incurred thus far by Tim and Pierre was approved by the <u>FSC</u> and to be processed by <u>AJ.</u>

4.5 Light pollution measuring

(7 Feb) Wim Filmalter's application to IDA Light Monitor Grant Program was successful. (8 May) Wim awaits feedback from Cape Nature/Anysberg when he could use it. Wim informed the project is still in abeyance for a while.

4.6 Star Partys event at SANBI KZN-NBG in PMB https://www.sanbi.org/event_cat/kwazulu-natal/ (11 Mar) The National Botanical Garden (NBG) in PMB requested ASSA to support a Star Gazing Event in celebration of their 150 years anniversary.

Lerika reported that the main contact, Mbuso Zondi, at the NBG in PMB is working on a motivation for funding and it is suggested that ASSA awaits the outcome from Mbuso's effort.

(11 Mar) Daniel informed that 3000 abstracts from Astronomers were received –more than for the Korea and the Vienna event. He urged members to contact Sally MacFarlane responsible for Outreach.

Daniel noted items to be included for an exhibition for African Institutes such as ASSA Poster, Sky Guides,

Flyers. Council members to provide further ideas to Daniel in support of GA with associated cost detail.

Daniel reported that of the >3000 abstracts, 2300 were accepted and registrations for those are in progress.

One of 4 Scholarships Committee members has not responded, and Claire suggested she uses the Convenor's casting vote. Claire proposed ASSA need another 2 people on the Committee and that ASSA possibly approach younger people to create a more active group. She also asked if ASSA could find someone who can take over as Convenor. <u>Daniel</u> offered to look into possible volunteers for joining the Committee.
