1	Welcome, Present, Apologies, Proxies received Derek Duckitt opened the 1st ASSA Council meeting for 2024/25 year, welcoming all members. Apologies received before & after meeting are noted under Attendance.
2	Previous Minutes of Meetings and Agenda The minutes of the Council meeting held 24 June 2024 were proposed to be approved by Chris Stewart and seconded by Case Rijsdijk. 3.2 Website changes

3.2.1 Join Us top menu item on website

(11 Mar) Auke created top menu item, <u>Join Us</u> on website but was unable to edit /create a new Form and called on Christian /SAAO IT to make changes requested.

(22 April) To resolve Join Us and Captcha issues: a plug-in Updraft for migrating the website to a WordPress single-site set-up at the SAAO. <u>Christian</u> can arrange Google Analytics.

Christian apologized for SAAO IT delay (due to staff shortages which should improve next month). He informed SAAO IT is busy extracting from the current multisite into a site of its own. It looks like no plugin (and hence no funds) might be required but extract still in progress.

More information should available early November. (Christian)

3.2.2 Search function

(22 April) Since the website review: reactivating the "Search" function (Christian)

(24 Jun) Christian informed Search button was added back to site. It was suggested to move it to the menu. As this requires changes to the site template, this shall be addressed once the site has been moved from the current WordPress multisite to a standalone site.

3.2.3 Captcha error

When completing/submitting either "Ask an Astronomer" or "Report a Sighting" forms on <u>Contact Us</u> the submission fails with error: "The reCAPTCHA was invalid. Go back and try it again." This issue awaits outcome of 3.2.1

3.3 Sending email to all Members

(22 April) Proposal for implementing an ASSA Member List

(24 Jun) Some Centres are in support, some not. Daniel proposed to work with Christian on an alternate option to allow members to opt in to mail list using Join Us tab on website and MailChimp. Daniel informed that he and Christian must still explore the option and will inform in due course, e.g. if there will be any cost involved. (Daniel, Christian)

3.4 ASSA Cloud repository

(22 April) <u>Chris de C</u> will check which Centres has accessed their space and will start contacting the Centres and work with them to get all onboard with placing their data in the cloud.

Chris de C reported on updates and actions outstanding:

Centres: Cloud archive was activated for Hermanus, Garden Route, Cape and Bloemfontein Centres.

A meeting with Pretoria Centre is scheduled. Johannesburg Centre must still be contacted.

Sections: Some Section Directors to still be contacted and their control activated.

ASSA Council: Case, Willie and Ian have full editorial control over the publication folder.

Mike Hadlow reminded Chris to also activate the Durban Centre and he undertook to contact Mike after the meeting ($\underline{\text{Chris de C}}$)

3.5 Dark Sky

3.5.1 Astro Tourism

(4 Oct) DSI Astro Tourism Strategy Plan: final plan to be presented following which funding will be known. Funding is likely to be dependent on ASSA being registered as a PBO.

Daniel confirmed the Astro-Tourism strategy was launched at an event in Carnarvon, gazetted 30 Sep:

and encouraged everyone to have a read. He noted that as it is a Government strategy, it does not come with funding but is an important tool for political funding support.

The meeting continued to have a good general discussion on Dark Sky and Astro-Tourism related items. Find the detail in the <u>meeting recording</u> from 07.29 to 22:44 min into the meeting.

Matie noted a number of implications that come with a designated dark sky area in terms of preserving dark skies, e.g. outdoor lightning, which will involve the professional body of the South African Council for Electrical Engineers.

Willem reported that Touwsrivier Tourism is really interested in Astro-Tourism and has already progressed some initiatives. He will give a talk at their upcoming AGM and one of the main topics will be Dark Sky.

Daniel noted that in terms of the current process, the government won't support a private game reserve running an Astro tourism programme.

Lerika noted the ASSA Dark Sky Discussion Group delivered some valuable insights and perhaps that effort could also now come in useful. The <u>last draft</u> by the Group to peruse.

<u>Daniel</u> will be attending a meeting next week on the topic and will ask if he may invite ASSA member/s to join the meeting, e.g. Matie.

4 4. Outreach

4.1 Astrophotography ("AP") Competition 2024

<u>Centres and Directors</u> are asked to consider making the Flyer available at sessions attended by the public / non-ASSA members.

In preparation of contacting G&L for their sponsorships of the 2025 AP competition, (which we hope to be available ~March 2025), <u>Lerika</u> will send a request to everyone asking for input about how to promote astrophotography and grow participants during the AP 2025 competition.

4.2 ASSA GMN Outreach Project (https://globalmeteornetwork.org/outreach/)

The project is listed on the <u>ASSA Outreach page</u> and the latest status available at: https://globalmeteornetwork.org/outreach/2024/04/10/south-african-cameras-installations/Update from Tim:

Both schools with the 4 cameras are now online and capturing data. Touwsrivier Primereskool has contributed to the pipeline since 7 August and Laingsburg High School since 2 September. On 18 September Tim presented an overview of the first results from the two schools and what the cameras are seeing on a nightly basis. And on 9 October Radim Stano described how to work with the data, and how the schools can access and work with the tutorial materials online, including tasks, games and competitions.

Currently being discussed are options to expand the coverage to other schools, and how to encourage greater participation from the learners.

An article on the process followed and results to date will be submitted for publication in MNASSA. As it is near end of the school year, not a lot will happened before mid-January.

Pierre and Tim will start to unpack how to get learners more involved.

If the application for another 4 camera is successful, they will discuss where to place those cameras.

5. 32nd IAU General Assembly: Cape Town 6 – 15 August 2024 https://astronomy2024.org/
Outcomes from the IAU GA are reported in August 2024 edition of MNASSA and includes excellent reports by Ian Glass and Kevin Govender, IAU Office of Astronomy for Development, who led the LOC. Kevin noted in his report: "More information will continue to be posted on www.astronomy2024.org which will live on with info about proceedings, legacy, pictures, recordings of the live streams, etc".

It was agreed to close this item.

6 6. ASSA Publications 6.1 SGAS 2025

Auke reported that the SGAS 2025 final press release should be available by end November.

AJ alerted he needs all SGAS 2025 orders for Centres and Country membership by 15 November.

Auke confirmed that no updates can be done to the SGAS 2025, and <u>Jacques</u> agreed to contact John to update the new ASSA Bloemfontein committee on the ASSA website.

8.1 ASSA POPIA Policy

In conclusion of this item it was noted that Country Membership form reflects the Society's POPIA Policy and <u>Centres</u> asked to include same.

8.2 Country Membership (12 Honorary Membership (max 15)

Andre reported the latest Country Membership:

124 active Country members including: 1 Associate, 12 Hon Members 7 Gratuity and 104 normal

members of which 55 renewed, 49 have not.

Willie said he had feedback from people who said the SGAS delivery problems a couple of years ago. The delay made them rethink if renewing membership is worth it seeing they can buy the SGAS earlier. He suggested maybe a follow-up mail to those who have not renewed, to encourage renewal. Andre said it was a good idea. He noted the PEP and the new PUDO option which is working very well. His system tracks when items are sent and received.

AJ commented he has been looking at the SGAS stats relating to Country membership, and also at stats on bookshop sales, because to a large extent, the two should correlate. He noted Country membership is doing quite well compared to say bookshop sales which is decreasing on average about 8% per year while Country membership is on a variance of less than 1%.

8.3 Hon Members

Honorarium

(24 Jun) Council noted the FSC accepted the proposal by AJ to increase the Honorarium to R750. Hon Members were asked to contact AJ for their honoraria payment – AJ reported 5 claimed thus far. The item is now closed.

Hon Member Clifford Turk

Not discussed at the meeting; noted for the record:

On 15 Oct, Ian Glass shared information received from Hon Member Cliff Turk's daughter about his passing at the age of 92 on Friday 13 September 2024. Ian mentioned:

"Cliff did a great deal for ASSA and was a former President, Business Manager, Treasurer, Hon Member, and recipient of the President's Award. He was a member of Cederberg Observatory for many years. He ran the Astronomy Base at the Senior Scout Adventure for many years. He was also a scout master, but I don't know much about this part of his life."

9 9. Governance

9.1 Register ASSA for tax under a VDP (Voluntary Disclosure Program) Application

(7 Jul) CTFS to be asked on process PBO registration and to provide a quotation (7 Feb) CTFS kindly offered to not charge ASSA unless cost involved becomes substantial. (8 May) The 3 willing unconnected persons (Daniel, Chris S, Pierre with Pierre the SARS rep.) have completed forms required by CTFS. CTFS will now start the application process. (24 Jun) CTFS informed of the allocated ASSA tax number 9229741260 and provided updated forms to be signed by Daniel, Pierre and Chris. The forms were signed/returned to CTFS 12 June. CTFS informed ASSA application for tax exemption is near completion and SARS will most probably send Pierre the confirmation for Tax Exemption.

AJ confirmed he has received correspondence from CTFS that tax for last year is zero, so it seems the Tax Exemption is in place.
