1	Welcome	John Lindsay-Smith – Johannesburg Centre Chair - fulfilling the role of AGM Host, welcomed everyone in attendance and opened the meeting.
		Apologies received were noted and are listed above under Attendance.
2	Previous Minutes	The minutes of the previous AGM meeting - held 26 August 2024 - were accepted. (Proposed by Chris Stewart, seconded by AJ Nel)
3	Report on Council	3. President's Report on Council (1:00 – 18:43) Derek extended his gratitude to Council, Section Directors, Centre committees, and all members whose voluntary dedication continues to drive the ASSA mission forward. Derek proceeded with the Report on Council. He said this year has seen significant progress across ASSA Sections, from groundbreaking observations to innovative outreach initiatives and proceeded to highlight laws accomplishments.
		highlight key accomplishments. He reminded that all reports are available on the <u>ASSA webpage</u> and the AGM Folder in the <u>ASSA Cloud</u> .

		Derek said he is profoundly grateful for the collective effort that has made ASSA a beacon of astronomical excellence. He said the Sections' achievements - from promoting astronomy to inspiring future amateur and professional astronomers - underscore the Society's vitality.
		In conclusion, he said he is looking forward to his second year as President and pledged his continued support. Together, ASSA will keep pushing boundaries in education, observation, and outreach.
		No questions were raised and John thanked Derek for his report.
4	Financials	4. Financials Report 2024/25 (20:44 to 33.40) The Treasurer, AJ Nel, presented the <u>Financial Report</u> .
		He reported that it was not a bad year. ASSA financials have not been in the red for the last 2 years and he does not envisage going into the red thanks to the Glacier investments.
		Conclusions: - Income derived from most sources remained stable Sanlam Glacier continued steady growth despite withdraws during the past two years Expenses in general on par with 2024, bar for non-payment of scholarships in 2024 No major expenses are foreseen for the 2024 to 2025 financial year.
